Second Sunday in Easter



Montana Synod LPA Program (Lay Pastoral Associate)

A Lay Pastoral Associate in the Montana Synod is a congregational lay person who has received religious, educational training, through the Montana Synod, in order to provide (in most cases) short term pulpit supply (ie, preaching) when the pastor is away, or if a congregation is without a pastor. Their role is to fill in for the basic pastoral duties such as providing Word and Sacrament, communion, and other roles as approved by the Bishop.

The LPA program is a 3 year journey of theological education with a cohort of other Lutherans from around Montana and Northern Wyoming in a retreat-type format. A new cohort is beginning in the coming months! If you have any interest in becoming an LPA or simply participating in the LPA training program, please let Pastor Jessie know in the coming weeks.



April Update

<u>Highlighting What We Do:</u> This month we are telling the story of one of our current Promise Place Shelter residents. A young student, full-time employee, and mother of three, she comes to Great Falls from out of state. Moving here for a career, she started by renting an apartment with a local property management company. Things went badly with the property managers, so she and her children moved into an income-based apartment. During this time, she continued working and attending clas-

ses but struggled to make ends meet. Unfortunately, things were not going well at the income-based property and within a few short months, eviction was imminent. Desperate and with no place to turn, GFPS Student Services had learned of her plight and put her in contact with Family Promise. Greg and Maggie were able to offer her, and her children shelter and the wraparound services she so desperately needed. In her words "They provided hope and gave us room to grow." Now that she and her children are settled, she is working with Neighborworks to learn about money management, and how to improve her credit in the hopes of being able to own her own home one day in the future. She says that Family Promise has made her feel "more supported than ever."


Great Falls. Neighborworks helps potential homeowners by providing homebuyer education, individualized financial coaching, and down payment assistance.



GOSPEL MESSAGE

Second Sunday in Easter

A Wild, Skeptical Hope

"Doubting Thomas" is nearly always meant as a pejorative, but Jesus shows up for him. It's easy to forget that Thomas is asking for nothing more than what Jesus has already provided to his friends—showing up for them, in the flesh. When he does the same for Thomas and Thomas exclaims, "My Lord and my God!" (John 20:28), Jesus responds, "Blessed are those who have not seen and yet have come to believe" (John 20:29). It's easy to hear this as if Jesus were chastising Thomas while he blesses the rest of us, but he does no such thing. He can show up for Thomas and bless the rest of us all at the same time

Can you even imagine what those days must have been like—those days between the crucifixion and resurrection, and then the days that followed, full to the brim with confusion and grief and rumors and wild, skeptical hope? Two thousand years can make us forgetful, as if those who were present in those moments had the luxury of knowing the entire story all at once, the way we do.

But they didn't. Regardless, Thomas believed in a God big enough to carry his doubts and uncertainty. He trusted that God was big enough to hold all his questions and his hope.

What are the big doubts you carry? What are your questions? What kind of wild, skeptical hopes do you have, that you hardly dare to utter out loud, even to your closest friends? Do they feel any different when you stop to wonder about letting God carry them with you?

Here, at the beginning of the Easter season, God has shown us that very little is truly impossible. Thomas believed as much, and he had the courage to ask for it. Jesus shows up in response to Thomas's bold ask, and through this witness, he blesses the rest of us

All of the disciples saw Jesus.


Thomas couldn't believe them.
