
#### 12th Sunday after Pentecost

As Jesus commends her bold faith, how might our church extend its mission to those on the margins of society? We are getting ready for our participation in God's Work Our Hands Sunday. This Sunday and next Sunday we will have project sign up sheets in the Narthex. You can sign up for your service project on one of those sign up sheets. Below we have a list of what the projects are, and how many people are needed for each project.

For those who do not wish or are unable to do a lot of physical labor, we will be filling hygiene kits for Family Promise of Great Falls. We have a goal of making 100 kits and in the upcoming weeks, we will be asking for donations for those kits. To make sure we have the items we need, we will have "shopping cards" with type of item needed, size, and how many. You may pick up a card, purchase the items (The Dollar Tree stores are ideal for these items) and return the items to Bethel by September 10th. If you would like to donate any dollar amount for purchase of items not donated, you may make an additional donation online or during our weekly offering noting hygiene kits in the memo line.

Service Projects are:

At Bethel:

- On the patio, paint the benches around the tree and clean up the leaves and debris—4 to 5 people
- Assemble Hygiene kits
- Make cards for Assisted living centers here in Great Falls.

Cameron Center/Rescue Mission/Women's Shelter

• There will be different jobs depending on the shelter volunteering for and we will have more details later. They are asking for 6-8 people for each facility.

Angel Center, services the homeless population, by providing, meals, showers, laundry service

• Prepare meal at Bethel: Spaghetti, Bread, dessert, salad for approximately 65 people. We will then deliver the meal to the center by 11:15. They start serving at 11:30—4 to prepare meal, maybe 6 to deliver and set up

Family Promise, Promise Place Shelter

• Yard clean up. Pick up debris, leaves, etc., pull a few weeks, tidy lawn—4 people

After our service projects are finished about Noon, we will meet back at Bethel for a pot luck.

## Where do I go to check in?


The Volunteer Entrance is through Door A and the Volunteer Check-in Table is on the right as you enter.

#### **GOSPEL MESSAGE**

#### August 20, 2023, 12th Sunday after Pentecost

#### **Holding Jesus Accountable**

As disturbing as the report of Jesus' callous-sounding encounter with the unnamed Canaanite woman may be to our ears, all around him, on both sides of their ethnic divide, were people who would have been outraged by any act of generosity or goodwill between a Jew and a Canaanite. So it's no surprise when the disciples urge Jesus to send her away. Animosities toward "those" on the other side of the border, between children of Canaan and children of Israel, were deeply entrenched and easily inflamed. Jesus appears to identify with the ill will.

All eyes and ears attend the scene. The shouting, then kneeling woman is in stubborn company with others whose protesting faith demands more than silence from God, who refuse to be rejected by God, who insist on being heard by God. She is in the company of Jacob, who wrestled with God through the night and




demanded a blessing; with Moses pleading for God's mercy upon stiff-necked people; with Job, not settling for a vindictive Creator. She's in tradition with the psalmist's entreaty "My God, . . . why [are you] so far from saving me?" (Psalm 22:1). She is beside Martha railing against Jesus' delay as her brother, Lazarus, lay dying, and beside the blind men shouting to Jesus above defiant crowds at Jericho.

The Canaanite woman is clear about the way of Jesus, so she dares to hold him—Son of David, face of God—accountable. Yes, her aggressive and, surely for many, objectionable faith in the mercy of Jesus against all evidence to the contrary results in her daughter's healing. What's more, her persistent challenge to Jesus becomes an enduring voice to be heard by any who dare claim that God's mercy is limited, God's help is restricted, or God's providence is settled. She raises her voice and takes a knee for the church of Jesus Christ, representing all the voices shouting, "Have mercy on me."




## Just for YOUth
