

Hello Bethel,

I want to begin by thanking you from the bottom of our hearts for your thoughts, prayers, cards, and support these last several weeks. Last time I wrote to you we were still in the hospital trying to get answers and making sure that Jade would be alright. At this time, we are home, working with counselors, support groups, friends, and family. We are still looking for answers on what happened to Jade and Kai, how to avoid it in the future, and why we couldn't stop any of it. Many of my days are filled with phone calls with hospital systems, insurance companies, and medical professionals who know far more than I do.

As you may have already heard from the Council, I will be taking some time away in the coming months. This time is not because I do not want to be there or because I wish to be far from you, but because I take my work very seriously and I want to be fully present for you and our community when I come back. The work of a Pastor is to care for the congregation, to teach and to preach, to visit and to hold folks' grief and joy during the ups and downs of life. At this time, I need to take some time to heal before I can do those things in the ways that fulfill my call. With that in mind, I will return to you at the beginning of November, with my first Sunday back being November 6th.

In the meantime, please do not hesitate to reach out via e-mail, text, or writing (the office has my info). While Jade and I asked for privacy in those very beginning days, we are hoping to begin to slowly reintegrate into the world in the coming weeks and work our way back into regular communication. I will not be able to answer your church questions or provide Pastoral care at this time, but I promise you do not have to be afraid to touch base or say hi as we walk through this time. Again, thank you for your love and your support, they truly mean the world to us during this immensely difficult time.

More Than a Logo

If the church has a universally recognized logo, it is probably the cross. But branding was probably not what Jesus was thinking about when he invited Peter and those who would come after him to take up their cross and follow. The cross that Jesus calls us to carry alongside him is instead the means by which God chooses to reveal grace in the midst of death.





Rather than follow in the way of Jesus, some-

times the church can simply get in the way. We want to be good followers. We want more people to experience what we have. But sometimes in our desire to draw larger crowds, we end up putting ourselves—our music, our ministries, our outreach—at the center and subtly leaving God aside. In the midst of a world that drives us to always want more, Jesus invites us to deny ourselves. The denial to which Jesus calls us is not about putting ourselves down or neglecting our own needs. But it is about centering the cross of Christ in our lives so that our desires and dreams begin to arc ever more in the direction of God's love and mercy at work in the world.

The cross that Jesus took up didn't just belong to him. Two bandits were crucified with him, one on either side, and the Romans crucified many more. The cross is more than a logo; it is a symbol that joins us to a suffering world. The cross is not an individual burden to carry; it is the whole church's work. Crosses adorn our steeples and worship spaces, but worship also empowers us to take up the issues of the day that are matters of life and death for so many, such as war and violence, housing and food security, racism and climate change. When we shoulder these "crosses" together, the church doesn't make its own way; we follow the way of Jesus.




