A MESSAGE FROM THE CONGREGATION

More Than Physical Nourishment For The Weekly Journey

This Sunday's readings and gospel message address feeding themes. The prophet Elijah is being fed by an angel in 1 Kings 19:4-8 even though he wanted to die. The pressure of his ministry was too much at that time. He had defeated the priests of Baal but now feared for his life by Jezebel. In verse 7, "The angel of the LORD came a second time, touched him, and said, 'Get up and eat, otherwise the journey will be too much for you.'" God had more plans for Elijah. He needed physical nourishment and also nourishment for his heart and mind to fulfill God's journey planned for him.

The gospel reading in John 6:35, 41-51 the gospel writer quotes Jesus, "I am the bread of life. Whoever comes to me will never be hungry, and whoever believes in me will never be thirsty." There are many other stories in the gospel dealing with Jesus feeding the people who listened to his message.

Jesus frequently uses vocabulary that was familiar to the people at that time. Jesus is talking about a different type of nourishment in this Sunday's gospel. Bread represented the major food source at that time. To live, one had to eat bread. "Bread of life" represents a metaphor for Jesus' teachings and his ministry. When we eat bread, we will have nourishment for part of the journey, but we will be hungry again. If we listen to Jesus' message to us, we will not be hungry again for the remaining part of the journey.

Ephesians 5:1-2 states, "Therefore be imitators of God, as beloved children, and live in love, as Christ loved us and gave himself up for us, a fragrant offering and sacrifice to God." Jesus showed us how to be imitators of God.

When we partake in Sunday's Holy Communion, the bread and wine provides us with the "nourishment" to do God's work as told by Jesus for the coming week.
