


BETHEL NOTES

Supporting Global Mission

"Go therefore and make disciples of all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father and the Son and the Holy Spirit, and teaching them to obey everything that I have commanded you."

We are followers of Jesus today because the earliest followers of Jesus took his words seriously and carried the message of God's love through Jesus Christ to the far ends of the earth. As ELCA Lutherans, we are in relationship with Christians across the globe through the World Council of



Churches and other ecumenical bodies. And we are connected with some 77 million other Lutherans across the globe through the Lutheran World Federation. Two of our closest connections in the Montana Synod are our companion Synods, the Cape Orange Diocese in South Africa, and the Bolivian Evangelical Lutheran Church. Perhaps you have met visitors from those churches as they have been in our synod. Or perhaps you have had an opportunity to visit their churches.

One of the structures that keeps our relationships going through changes in bishops, changes in committees, changes in congregations is the Regional Representative. Regional Representatives, like all other missionaries, are supported both by churchwide funds, and by congregations. In Latin America, our Regional Representative, Gustavo Driau, is new. And, as an Argentinian national, he does not have a home congregation in the ELCA. Since the Montana Synod is in partnership with the Bolivian Church, and, by extension, with Gustavo Driau, we have been asked to consider congregational sponsorships of Gustavo. Some of our congregations were sponsors of his predecessors, Justin and Kerry Eller. We invite you to consider sponsoring Gustavo.

Gustavo was introduced to the Lutheran Church in elementary school, and was confirmed and became an active lay leader. He served the Argentinian Church as director for diakonia and mission development, and then served the Lutheran World Federation in Latin America. We know that many congregations sponsor missionaries and YAGMs with whom they have a connection. That is wonderful, and so appreciated. We are asking congregations who may not have a global mission partner to consider a covenant relationship to sponsor Gustavo Driau. There are many ways that we can support global mission: prayer, communication, visits, financial sponsorship. Please keep all our global personnel in prayer. They are working hand in hand with God's beloved children in many countries, in many contexts, living the Gospel and serving our brothers and sisters in Christ.

Message from the Pastor

A Lenten Journey to the Easter Vigil

OVERVIEW

This year's Lenten Mid-Week Worship will involve reading and reflections on a few of the salvation stories from the Easter Vigil Liturgy. We will discover together that these are not just *old* stories, but also *our* stories. Stories are accessible to us. Each of the stories can be seen as imaging God, Christ's resurrection, and the baptismal life. They offer the hearers an image with which to picture salvation: the earth is God's perfect creation; we are saved in the ark during the flood; we escape the enemy army; our bones are brought back to life; we are thrown into a fiery furnace and emerge untouched by the fire.

Bethel is blessed with a number of gifted Lay Pastoral Associates (LPA's) and they, along with Pastor Steve, will help lead those of us who gather to reflect on these salvation stories. Our Lenten journey begins with **Ash Wednesday worship**, **February 14th**, **at 7pm** with the imposition of ashes, and holy communion. We will begin our **mid week Lenten Worship on Thursdays at 6:15** for a soup supper hosted by ministry groups from the congregation and we will **worship at 7pm**. The dates, stories, and leaders are listed as follows:

February 22 – Creation (Genesis 1: 1 – 2:4a) Pastor Steve Van Gilder - Soup Supper Host: Bethel Council The resurrection of Jesus Christ is the beginning of life for us all. Just as the creator God forms the earth out of chaotic waters and shines light onto primeval darkness, so the resurrection of Christ pulls us from death through baptism into fruitful life with all the good earth and enlightens our life in Christ.

March 1 - Flood (Genesis 7: 1 - 5, 11 - 18; 8: 6 - 18; 9: 8 - 13) Jim Carlson, LPA

In the story of the flood, God re-creates the world by sending forty days of rain to destroy all that is evil. In the resurrection of Christ, God is making all things new, and in our baptism, we are cleansed and brought to new life.

March 8 - Deliverance at the Red Sea (Exodus 14: 10 -31; 15: 20 - 21) Dave Scholten, LPA

In this archetypal story, God vanquishes evil and liberates the oppressed. By the resurrection, God liberates us from slavery to sin and brings us through the waters of baptism to safety.

March 15 - Valley of he Dry Bones (Ezekiel 37: 1 - 14) Steve Smith, LPA

For Christians, the valley of the dry bones can be interpreted in various ways: a picture of the resurrection of Jesus Christ, a promise about the baptized life, and a hint of the final resurrection of the dead. In the action of God, the Word, and the Spirit, Christians see also a picture of the Triune God.

March 22 - Deliverance from the fiery furnace (Daniel 3: 1 – 29) Shirley Cayko, LPA

For each of us there will be a time when we are engulfed by fire. Because of the resurrection of Christ, we can be confident that the Son of God will be with us, no matter what or where the furnace.

2018 Annual Meeting Highlights

Pastor Steve has been our pastor for 14 years and we are grateful!

Mission Freedom campaign raised a total of \$297,732 from 32 pledges. Assuming the pledges come through, we will have a balance of \$288,000 at the end of 5 years. The mortgage will be paid off in 2028.

The congregation approved the updates to the Constitution. They are:

Mission Endowment by-laws were voted to be included in the Constitution; the amount the council can approve in budget expenditures before going to the congregation was changed from \$500 to \$5400. (This number had not been updated for 20 years); The number of people on the council was changed from 12 to 7-9 members; The number of people on the nominating committee was changed from 6 to 4.

The new council members will be: Kaleb Stringer (youth), Ben Gooldy (young adult), and Marilyn Carlson. The council is now reconciled with the Constitution where it is stated there will be 1 youth and 1 young adult on the council. Marilyn will become the new Secretary.

The following members are leaving the council and were voted in to serve on the nominating committee: Kristine Voorhees, Jenny Will, Mary Lou Norbie, and Dave Scholten.

Matt and Judy Crampton were voted in to serve as delegates to Montana Synod Assembly.

Dan & Steph Richardson were voted in to serve as representatives to Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp.

Kris Voorhees gave the President's report which outline all the work the council and other members have accomplished over the past year. She also reminded us of our Mission Statement: God Calls Us, God Transforms Us and God Sends us...make sure you are listening!

The pastor acknowledged the members leaving the council and thanked them for their service: Mary Lou Norbie, Dave Scholten, Jenny Will and Kristine Voorhees, who received a plaque in recognition of being the council President.

The new officers on the 2018 council are: Jo Ann Dullum (President), Doug Sexe (Vice President), and Marilyn Carlson (Secretary).
