## A MESSAGE FROM THE CONGREGATION

John 2: 1-11 is a story of a miracle. It is much more than that, however, as it is the very beginning of Jesus ministry. It also may be a window into the final days of Jesus ministry. In this gospel, Jesus is revealed as the good wine of the true vine. Near the end of his ministry, he identifies himself as the true vine.

Let's looks at this setting, as told by John. The setting is a wedding, of which I think we can all relate. Here are a few points that make this wedding special:

- 1) There is a special need at this wedding, and that need is for wine. There is a lack of wine for this wedding party. As a father who has experienced 3 daughters' weddings, I can certainly relate!
- 2) It takes a miracle to address this need. The miracle we have all heard before tells us Jesus turned water into wine.
- 3) There is a response to that miracle. The response to the miracle at Cana is the first of Jesus's "signs." It "revealed his glory," and as a result, "his disciples believed in him". This is also one of the first times John talks about the disciples.

Let's look at the significance of this wedding. Jesus did not ask to perform this miracle, nor did it appear he thought of this. He was asked by his mother, Mary, to take care of this embarrassing situation of the lack of wine. Mary was only a guest this wedding, but she, of all people, would know the miracle of Jesus through his birth. This is the only time Mary is mentioned in the Gospel of John, except at the cross. Jesus says to her, "Woman, my time has not come." Mary, apparently knowing the powers of Jesus, instructs the servants, "Whatever he says to you, do it." I think this is more than just a trusting mother.

It is not known why this turned out to be Jesus "coming out party" or the significance of it. You would think turning water into wine would be trivial compared to the other miracles, or as John says, "signs" seen in the Bible, such as healing the sick, feeding the hungry, or raising the dead. Maybe in this case, Jesus was just enjoying a good party, as we all do. Why is this first act so important? It shows us the "fullness we have all received through Jesus' presence in the world".

At this point in the story it may appear the purpose of Jesus' signs is to inspire belief. Indeed, this is one of the purposes of this Gospel - "that you may come to believe that Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God, and that through believing you may have life in his name".

Jesus turned water into wine to prove his real nature to the disciples for the first time. The ultimate purpose of the miracle was to reveal His Glory, with the result being faith in Him. May we all show our faith and trust in Jesus throughout our everyday lives, without the need of "signs".

In 1945 German-occupied Poland contained 457 camp (concentration/labor/ extermination) complexes. John and his parents, residents of Bayreuth in Southern Germany, found themselves in one of these camps. Gaining refugee status when the war ended they immigrated to the U.S. and made their home in Great Falls. John has twice returned to Poland and will share stories and pictures of the changes since overcoming post-war Communism in the early 1990's. Poland is now a member of the European Union and was one of the first Former Soviet Republics to join NATO.
