

Then, opening their treasure chests, they offered him gifts of gold, frankincense, and myrrh. Matthew 2: 10,11 NRSV

Happy New Year! A Blessed Epiphany Season!

This Sunday we begin the season of the church year called Epiphany. Epiphany means "manifestation." It is the day which celebrates Jesus' being revealed...made known to ALL the nations (the Gentiles)...represented by the magi.

As the story is told to us from the gospel of Matthew, some wisemen or astrologers traveled from the East (Persia..today called Northern Iraq and Northern Iran). That would have been at least 1,000 miles to Bethlehem. It would have taken many months, riding on a camel. They practiced a faith different from the people of God, the people of Israel. As they studied the night sky, a star in the sky had led them to Jerusalem, asking, "Where is he who is born King of the Jews?" They had come to worship this new born King. These travelers from the East ended up in Jerusalem and there met up with King Herod. But Herod was troubled by their question. Frightened because he was the King over that region called Judea. He didn't want any competition. He pointed them to Bethlehem and then asked them to let him know of where to find Jesus, the Christ. (Because when he knew where, he would kill him)

They followed the star which led them to Mary, Joseph and Jesus and to him they paid homage. **Gold** has great value, it is a symbol of kingship on earth.. **frankincense** is a perfume used for incense; and **myrrh** is a common anointing oil. All tangible gifts they believed were fitting to offer for a King.

God used the faith and knowledge of some astrologers from the East to bring them to Jesus, the new born King. God used scientists who practiced other religions to let King Herod and the religious leaders of the people in on the news that their Messiah had been born.

They were good at studying stars ~ it was their passion and they offered their passion and most prized gifts to Jesus. So, we too, offer our passions...our best...our gifts in service to Jesus. One of my favorite authors, Frederick Buechner, says, "when we offer our best...when our passions...the things which we are gifted with by God....are offered in service to Jesus...through our neighbor...then we are doing what God wishes for us to do. For it is when our passions and gifts, offered with joy and gladness, meet up with the world's – our neighbor's deepest hunger..deepest need....we are making a holy connection. People of God...like the wisemen...offer your passions and your gifts to Jesus. And may they be used to bring Jesus' light and life to the world.
