PASTOR STEVE'S MESSAGE

Considering our Welcomes and Farewells

Jesus had attained rock star status. He had healed many with the power of God. His teaching authority and ministry had touched the lives of young and old, alike, and brought restoration and wholeness but also skepticism and countless questions. Crowds great in number were following him and I can imagine hearing this word uttered on the streets and villages of Galilee, "Come see and hear the prophet who has a healing touch, can teach with an authority unlike any other and can even tame wind and wave!"

Curiosity led many to Jesus. The desperate courageously reached out to him, too. But then he returned to his hometown, Nazareth, and the reception was anything but gracious. Jesus returned to Nazareth with his disciples and taught in the synagogue but did not even get one "amen!" from the worshipping community. As a matter of fact, all he received was a mixture of astonishment, skepticism and disbelief. The town folk were even offended by him. Their lack of hospitality and nearsightedness Jesus chalked up to the trials of a prophet. But it also led to them missing out on something special as they were not open to God's Spirit-God's gift to them.

This gospel reading for this Sunday leads me to consider how I welcome and bid farewell. Like you, I have been on the receiving end of some gracious welcomes and felt included and affirmed for who I am. Those experiences felt good. Sadly, like you, there have also been those moments of feeling unwelcome, unacknowledged and distanced from others. Those experiences not only left me feeling devalued but also reminded me that I still have room for growth and for

improving my welcome to others. Jesus left his hometown synagogue and went out into the surrounding villages, calling on all to give up on the "it's all about me, self-serving life," in exchange for the "it's all about God..and serving God by serving other's life." That message is for us to embrace and to share, today. Jesus sends us out into the world to discover and to re-discover God's gracious hospitality in places which we may never have thought to look for it or to see it.

On Sunday, we will consider our welcomes and our farewells in the light of Jesus' teaching and practice. We will have the occasion to share our farewell and Godspeed with the Arvanetes family. Vann, Jodi and Max Arvanetes are leaving our community to take up the next chapter of their life in Billings and it is important that we bid them farewell and offer them Godspeed. If you are unable to be present in worship on Sunday, to bid farewell and to send them with our well wishes and God's blessing, then keep them in your prayers, give them a call and/or send them a card.

The Scriptures make many references to practicing God's gracious, wide welcoming embrace as well as to blessings and farewells and I leave you with one of them...

"Let mutual love continue. Do not neglect to show hospitality to strangers, for by doing that some have entertained angels without knowing it." Hebrews 13: 1, 2
