Pastor Steve's Message

[Jesus] said to them [disciples] "Let us go across to the other side." Mark 4:35

The gospel reading assigned for this Sunday is the familiar Markan story of Jesus' calming the storm on the sea as he and his followers were making their way "to the other side" of the Sea of Galilee. According to Mark's account the "other side" was foreign territory. It was the land of the gentiles. It was an intentional move towards the stranger, the other, the uncomfortable and even risky move towards those who were considered enemies of the house of Israel. Yet, it was a move led by Jesus for the sake of God's love ~ a far reaching and all embracing love for the world.

Today, Jesus is still at work leading his followers (the church) into places...relationships which are familiar and foreign to us. It is into an everchanging world. A world that is indifferent, even hostile towards the church. But a world which is also desperately hungry for love and acceptance. Who might be those whom we as individuals, the community of faith, are being called to extend Jesus' love, acceptance, and hospitality? Who are the people and where are the places yet untouched by Jesus' all inclusive love due to the obstacles of hatred and fear? Jesus says to us, "Let us go...to the other side." The promise is that he is with us and leading us into new territory, new relationships, and needs to be served. Leading us through the obstacles of indifference, hatred, fear, and all which would hold us back from the would he has called us to love and bless.


Author and theologian, Frederick Buechner preached a sermon on this gospel which got to the heart of this timely message for the church today.

From Buechner's sermon: "Go...Go for God's sake, and for your own sake, too, and for the world's sake. Climb into your little tub of a boat and keep going."

June Council Meeting Highlights

The Council met on June 12th. Pastor Len Shatkus has approached the Council with a proposal to start a new outreach ministry in Bethel. The specifics are still taking shape but the idea is to reach out to our "neighbors" in the community that would not typically walk through the church doors on a Sunday, but whom are looking for some sense of belonging to a larger community. The emphasis will be on "mission". He would like to use Bethel Fellowship Hall as a place to meet, have conversation and build relationships. His new ministry will be called ""Ba' Bar Nabbas" (Daughter-Son-Encouragement/Community). The Council's devotional "Reclaiming the 'C' Word" discussed the need to pray more, and when we pray, we should be prepared to listen, not do all the talking. Kaleb & Lillian leave for the Houston Youth Gathering on June 26th. There will be a prayer gathering for them at 12:30PM at Bethel. Mick Davis has been busy getting bids to fix our negative drainage issue on the west side of the church. He has also received 3 bids to repair/remodel the bathrooms in the Gathering Place. Both projects will begin soon. We approved a background check policy several months ago for employees of the church and anyone who works with children. The Council approved the use of VICTIG, a background check company out of Utah. In the upcoming months, Bethel ministries will be highlighted in the bulletin, Bethel Notes, at Sunday worship and on the video screens in the narthex. Be watching to see the amazing work God is doing with our hands!
