


BETHEL NOTES

Words from the Bishop - Serve the world, especially the poor and those in need

This has been a tough winter. Many congregations have had to cancel services on one or more Sundays. We Live in hope that the higher than normal snowpack will lead to good harvest and provide relief from last summer's fire season.

As you know, people living in isolation and in poverty have been adversely affected by the snow. They are running out of food and fuel. Some of you may have read of the needs on the Blackfeet Reservation. Our full communion partners, the United Methodists, have provided a grant and are coordinating response.

The Montana Synod is working to provide food and firewood to the Northern Cheyenne. We have sent a semi of food, enough to feed 600 families for 5 days. We need to raise \$5000 to pay for the food and transportation. When Montana was on fire last summer, other synods sent us disaster assistance. Now we need to ask you, the congregations of the Synod, to reach into your pockets and help our Northern Cheyenne neighbors.

Why the Northern Cheyenne, you may ask? Dick Deschamps, our Montana Synod Disaster Coordinator, has access to information on all the disaster areas in the state, and where the greatest need is. The greatest need, with the fewest resources is the Northern Cheyenne. Please read his report, immediately below.

I ask you to keep the Northern Cheyenne and all others experiencing hunger and deprivation in

prayer. And I ask you to open your hearts and your wallets to help the Northern Cheyenne now. Please send checks to the Montana Synod and write "disaster" on the memo.

Disaster Update

It has been a while since I have communicated with you. The last time was when we were winding down from wildfires which devastated part of the state in summer-fall of 2017. We are now working our way through winter weather condition situations which affected large portions of the state, but the affects were possibly more keenly felt on the Blackfeet, Ft. Belknap and Northern Cheyenne Indian Reservations. Partnerships with the State and local emergency managers, Tribal governments, local business entities and voluntary organizations were able to stabilize services and bring needed relief to those affected.

As a result of your generous donations to the Synod Disaster Fund over the last 2 years, we were able to provide food, in conjunction with the Montana Food Bank Network, to feed 600 families for 4-5 days, on the Northern Cheyenne Indian Reservation. This food is in the process of being boxed and distributed to families isolated from their normal food channels due to excessive snow. Our help is much appreciated. We also had four volunteers from the Billings and Red Lodge area travel to Lame Deer to help box the food. Thank you to those four from American Lutheran and King of Glory Lutheran in Billings; and Messiah Lutheran in Red Lodge.

Unfortunately this expenditure depleted our disaster account, at least the one which resides in the Synod bank account. The other disaster account still resides with the members and congregations of the ELCA in Montana. It is my wish and prayer that you and your congregations can find ways to continue to keep this fund healthy so that we are always able to respond rapidly to those in need, as we were able to do with the Northern Cheyenne Community.



Disaster update (cont'd)

We are blessed with great moisture this year, but we could also be faced with flooding situations very shortly. Disasters happen when you suspect they might, but often when you least anticipate them. One way, we as a church can easily be prepared to help the wider community, is through financial donations. Please help today. Se below how to do that:

Ways you can help:

Food banks are a source for food to help the shelters and families in general when they are evacuated from their homes. Food banks in the affected areas accept offers of food and money to help them remain a resource in times of disaster. Please contact your local food bank to see how you can best help out.

As a rule of thumb it is better to give money than goods. The exception to this would be specific requests for items from the emergency managers and agencies on site. Often times, unsolicited items provided in disaster go unused, because they are not the items needed. It also takes additional time and effort to organize and make available these items. When emergency managers and agencies have funds, they can purchase, often at a discount, the specific items required in a timely fashion.

Montana Synod maintains a disaster relief fund, funded entirely by your donations to help unmet needs for folks who have a disaster related need with no way to fund it. We anticipate that this fund will be utilized more as we become more aware due to our increased interest in being a part of disaster response and recovery. Your donations to that fund are always appreciated. Donations can be mailed to the Synod office at 3125 5th Avenue South, Great Falls, MT 59405-3337.

Aside from human needs, these winter storms have caused a shortage of hay in the affected areas mentioned earlier. The Montana Department of Agriculture operates the Montana Hay Hotline where hay and or money donations can be

Above all else, please keep those affected by disaster, responders and victims, in your prayers.


If you would like to write a check you can make it out to Bethel and footnote "MT Synod Disaster Fund/Blackfeet" in the memo line.
