


BETHEL NOTES

Sixth Sunday of Easter



This Sunday's image of the life the risen Christ shares with us is the image of friendship. We are called to serve others as Jesus came to serve; but for John's gospel, the image of servanthood is too hierarchical, too distant, to capture the essence of life with Christ. Friendship captures the love, the joy, the deep mutuality of the relationship into which Christ invites us. The Greeks believed that true friends are willing to die for each other. This is the mutual love of Christian community commanded by Christ and enabled by the Spirit.

I Have Called You Friends

Friends.....that is what Jesus calls his disciples in this week's assigned gospel reading. So I have been thinking about friends and how it is that some friends have become as close to me as a brother or a sister while others are simply acquaintances. Why is that? I asked the Logos middle schoolers how they would define a friend and they shared with me some desired qualities and virtues. "A friend is someone who is trustworthy." "A friend is loyal." "A friend is one who shares common interests and values." "A friend is one who is there for you...who listens to your problems, and helps you." Here is what Jesus says about friends to his disciples in John's gospel....

12-15 "This is my commandment, that you love one another as I have loved you. No one has greater love than this, to lay down one's life for one's friends. You are my friends if you do what I command you. I do not call you servants any longer, because the servant does not know what the master is doing; but I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything that I have heard from my Father." **John** 15: 12 - 15

Jesus' friends are those who love one another. His friends are not merely dutiful servants because servants are not privy to their master's thoughts and plans. Jesus calls us friends because he has confided in us..passed along to us what he has heard from his Father and our God. And, finally to be Jesus' friend is to love one another and to extend his love to the world. God loves wholly, sacrificially, completely. We're called to do the same. This is all our life's calling as Jesus saw this as the greatest commandment:

To love a neighbor, to love a friend, to love a stranger, to love an enemy. In the gospel of Luke, Jesus tells his followers that betrayal will come "at the hands of parents, brothers, relatives and friends." Luke 21

This is where it gets difficult. Jesus' command to love friends, strangers, enemies, those different from us and who will not love us back will seem to us an impossible task. Our commitment and efforts to love unconditionally and sacrificially ~ as Iesus loves ~ will be taxed, tire and fall short of the mark. But God has a deep well of love from which we can draw as we will quickly exhaust our own resources. And if God would choose to include us and ALL in God's love and call upon us to love one another, then God will supply us with what we need. We've been friended by Jesus. We have been brought into a relationship of reciprocal love and into a community of friends. We have been given the task of going out and sharing this revelation with the world. With God's help, we will expand our comfort zones and the community of Jesus' friends.

Connecting scripture and life....

When we approach guests and neighbors, how can we shift our attitude toward "look, there are friends here" in creating welcome? Consider what small and large seeds of love you are or can plant in the lives of your neighbors and friends.

What small acts of kindness, mercy, and grace can you extend to another as you move through this week?
