PASTOR STEVE'S MESSAGE

"God, my God, I can't thank you enough."

"You did it: you changed wild lament into whirling dance; You ripped off my black mourning band and decked me with wildflowers. I'm about to burst with song; I can't keep quiet about you. God, my God, I can't thank you enough." Psalm 30: 11, 12 from *The Message*

Lately, my early morning east looking gazes out my kitchen window have been the gifts of some spectacular sunrises. Gifts for the beginning of the day.

The movement from night to daybreak is a reliable one and it can be a spectacular one as well. But no less spectacular is the movement from lament to praise and thanksgiving. The psalmist is mourning a loss. Then God brought about a transformative moment, one which involved a radical new look. Off with the "mourning band" and on with a bouquet of "wildflowers." Emotions were transformed from "wild lament into whirling dance."

In her book titled, *Grateful: The Transformative Power of Giving Thanks*, author Diana Butler Bass, observes a few things which are true about feeling grateful ~

thankful, namely, that it is situational, emotional and it is typically an unplanned response. "For all of its uniqueness and complexity, there is a common core to feeling grateful: we recognize a circumstance, event, or situation (even if it is a trial) as a gift, we have received some unexpected benefit, we respond with words and actions, and we become our best selves in the process."

It was indeed a grace moment. The psalmist confessed that God brought about this change. Their heart is full of gratitude, so full, that it was impossible to keep quiet, it (the heart) is "about to burst with song" – a song of praise and thanks.

Big Sky sunrises (and sunsets) can be causes for thanksgiving to God and so can the gift of family, friends and faith community. As we take notice of the passing of time...from night to daybreak... the experiences of the highs and lows of life...let us also take notice of the many blessings, big and small. The unplanned, unexplainable and transformative moments that have come to us as gifts from God. May God move you to respond with not only words but also with actions..."becoming your best selves" and say, "God, my God, I can't thank you enough."
