PASTOR STEVE'S MESSAGE

Advent Faith

A new Church Year begins this Sunday with First Sunday of Advent. The word advent comes from the Latin word, *adventus*, which means "coming," or "arriving." There are three advents, The first is the coming of Jesus in his birth in Bethlehem. The second is the coming of Jesus among us now. Christ coming among us through the means of grace: in the waters of baptism, in the sacrament of holy communion, through the Word of God (Scriptures) and in the people of God ~ the community of faith. And the third, is the coming yet to come ~ Christ's coming at the end of time ~which is spoken of in this Sunday's gospel reading.

This First Sunday in Advent begins with headlines of future events like we see in the headlines today: It is of a world gone awry.... "Sun, moon, stars, earth, sea, in an uproar...powers of the heavens shaken.... People all over the world in a panic....breathless of what is coming upon the world." Why do we have to hear Jesus telling us about a world collapsing into chaos? Why can't we just skip over texts like these? Why not? Because texts like these remind us that our world longs for the hope of redemption. The Greek word which translates, redemption, is unique to Luke's gospel. It suggests a "loosing or releasing" from anything that constrains. And my-oh-my do we need God to free us...to release us from all that would constrain us, chiefly our sin. But also the fears which would hold us captive. The darkness and despair that would that would keep hope and joy at bay.

The message of Advent is when all is coming apart at the seams, God's promise of hope is spoken to remind us that "our redemption is drawing near." Jesus says, "Heaven and earth will pass away, but my words will not pass away." If the future were not the promise of Jesus Christ but the predictable outcome of present trends, despair would simply overwhelm you and I.

When we least expect it and when there is no evidence for it, God's power comes into this world...into our very own lives in ways the world itself could never predict or foresee. To bring release and freedom from that which constrains us.

Sure, we cannot deny that nations are and will continue to suffer distress. We cannot deny that natural disasters are on the rise. We cannot deny that we are choking on our fears. But we also cannot deny that God is faithful to God's promises. And God has promised us Jesus Christ, and that our redemption is entwined with his.

Advent faith also invites you and I to dare to yearn for more. It invites us to be alert...expectant...to stand erect with heads raised, a hopeful posture. For our redemption is drawing near, and advent faith, God's grace at work in us, will lead us, and help us to see the promised Jesus in our midst.

Come, gather for worship this Sunday and welcome the gift of Advent.


