




22nd Sunday After Pentecost

IN LOVING MEMORY

Reverend Leonard (Len) J. Shatkus

January 10, 1955 - September 29, 2018

Leonard who was the son of the late Leonard and Getrude (Wynne) Shatkus was born in Scranton, PA on January 10, 1955. He was raised in Inkerman and graduated from Pittston Area High School, Wilkes University, Wilkes-Barre, PA, graduating with a B.A. in Philosophy. He graduated Cum Laude from Regis College, University of Toronto with an S.T.M. degree (Master of Sacred Theology). He attended the Toronto School of Theology, University of Toronto, in Toronto, Ontario, Canada, graduating with an M.Div. He married Gail Lee Knaus on June 27, 1992.

His ministries took him to Brazil, Florida, Massachusetts, Pennsylvania, Ohio and Montana. He returned from disability twice to serve small Montana congregations. He served Nathanael and Volmer Churches (the Dagmar parish), and a UCC parish in Plentywood, and later served the UCC church in Baker. At the time of his death he was active at Bethel Lutheran Church in Great Falls.

Leonard is survived by his brother, John (wife, Karen) of Santa Clarita, CA, nieces Jill Williams (husband, Dwayne) of Neenach, CA and Wynne Campbell (husband, Ryan) of Torrance, CA, nephew Patrick Shatkus(fiancée, Liz Masucci) of Philadelphia, PA, grand-nephew, Leonard Patrick "LP" Campbell and cousins from the Wynne and Shatkus families. He was preceded in death by his wife, Gail (Knaus) Shatkus in 2017.

A memorial service will be held on October 27, 2018 at 1:30pm at Bethel Lutheran Church in Great Falls, MT with graveside committal immediately following the service at Highland Cemetery in Great Falls. A reception will follow at Bethel Lutheran Church in the Fellowship Hall after the graveside service.

Bible Study: The Gospel of Luke

Beginning on Sunday, November 4th, a Bible study will begin on the Gospel of Luke and will be led by Pastor Steve. Luke's gospel is arguably the most loved of the four gospels and will be the focus of Year C (beginning Sunday, December 2nd) of the three year lectionary cycle. Readings from Luke will appear forty times on Sundays and Festivals and so it is important to spend some time in the Gospel and explore the questions and meaning for our day. The Lukan study will be offered after worship and on Thursday mornings at 10am. We will begin with some background information on Luke's gospel and talk about some of the major themes.

FROM THE CONGREGATION

I was introduced to Family Promise by Brian Williams on Rock Center about six years ago. The program touched my heart and I thought about it all week. The following Sunday there was an announcement in the bulletin that the Great Falls Ministerial Association was considering bringing the program to Great Falls. Several meetings were held, committees formed and our work began.

During the two years of raising money, visiting other churches, working on securing a board of directors, buying a van, buying a cargo trailer and all of the many other things that had to be done before opening our doors, we learned so much about working with other churches toward a common goal. Many of us have become friends, having dinner in each others homes, going to events together and often commenting that if it were not for Family Promise, we would not know each other.

There has also been a change for Bethel's congregation. Many of us knew people by sight but not by name. Now we visit more after church, we are excited about serving dinner or spending time during Family Promise with each other. I hear comments of gratitude all the time.

Our guest families teach each of us so much. We hear their stories of a hard life, how they value the few belongings they have, how hard they are willing to work to make life better for their children and work toward reaching and maintaining a stable life. Most of us cannot possibly know their pain, their struggles but our goal is to help them through this rough time and get back on their feet and moving forward.

The doors to Family Promise were opened January 10, 2015. To date we have assisted 311 individuals, 179 were children in 93 families. 68 families were placed in homes. We do make a huge difference.

Jim Kiser and a group from the Great Falls Rescue Mission recently visited the Hub and learned about our program. As we have said many times, we should work together – compliment each others program as we are not in competition. We serve a different population of homelessness. We share a common goal– to serve God's children and their families to reach and sustain an independent life.



Bethel Lutheran Church started at the beginning of this program and we continue to grow in service. I am very grateful and blessed to serve with such a wonderful congregation. God Calls Us – God Transforms Us – God Sends Us.
