WHAT WILL YOUR LENT MEAN?

Ash Wednesday is less than a week away. Lent's official beginning. Blow the trumpet! Let it begin! Hold on! So, what is Lent really all about ? What does it mean to the church? And just as importantly, "What does it mean to you?"

Most of us have some pretty good ideas of what Lent is about. It is a 40 day time period which the church observes, from Ash Wednesday until Easter, during which we observe some ancient practices rooted in our Judeo/Christian history. It begins with the ashen cross, here made on our brow OR on our wrist, if you prefer. Reminding us of our finitude, our frailty, our need to live a life of repentance. It is a time when we must come clean, and admit that even the word "sin" is a hard word to get to roll off of our lips. It involves giving something up. (Practice of Fasting) Or... for some, adding something more to your life. (Practice of Prayer). It is a time of growing in sacrificial giving, (Practice of Giving Alms), money given to help those who are the poor. Here at Bethel, the monies/alms collected in our Lenten Offerings will once again be given in support to help those in need via thePastor's Discretionary Fund.


There have been years in my life, when I felt like Lent was the adding of one more thing that I hadn't time to do. When my failure at a faith practice, like trying to give something up, or trying to pray more often, and failing miserably would lead me to berating myself for lack of discipline and heighten my sense of inadequacies. As you, as we, ponder what our Lent will mean, might we imagine it in new ways?

This Lenten Season, we will be lifting up the theme of justice. The theme is based on Micah 6: 8 and how the theme of justice toward God, toward others, toward self and toward creation will

We welcome one and all as we celebrate Ash Wednesday, and as we did last year, our Logos Youth from grades 2 through High School will be assisting in the service with readings, leading prayers, serving communion and ushering. 


