Bethel's Mission Statement

GOD CALLS US. GOD TRANSFORMS US. GOD SENDS US. BETHEL.

This mission statement was intentionally written to be short and to the point. One that would be easy enough to remember and to remain a part of our lives and the life of this congregation. This mission statement also makes clear that God is the subject and verb...the initiator and actor when it comes to our individual and community of faith's life with God. God is all about a relationship with us and the world we live in. God always takes the lead and acts.

It all begins with a call. In the Season of Epiphany the assigned lectionary readings are God's call stories. Last Sunday, we heard the story of Jesus' baptism. Obedient to God's call, Jesus showed up at the River Jordan to be baptized by John and Matthew's gospel tells us it was to "fulfill all righteousness." In a very public way Jesus' baptism reveals his allegiance to God's righteousness (or justice). The voice from heaven reveals Jesus identity as the Son whom God dearly loves. On Sunday we will hear the call stories of the first disciples. Jesus noticed some following after him and asked them, "What are you looking for?" And they asked him, "Where are you staying?" Jesus invited his curious followers, "Come and see." One of the curious followers was Andrew and he led his brother, Simon Peter, to Jesus.

In our baptism into the death and resurrection of Jesus, we were united to Christ, to Christ's church (Body of Christ) and to his mission. In baptism we were ordained into ministry, called to serve God's purposes. It is a disciple of Jesus' foremost vocation. The One who calls is faithful to his promises. The Apostle Paul writes to the church in Corinth, "God is faithful, and you who were called by him to partnership with his Son, Jesus Christ our Lord." 1 Cor. 1: 9, CEB. As partners with Jesus, may we trust that the God who calls us into relationship will also sustain us in the relationship and mission we share.


