

## God calls us. Bethel.

Last week's article was about the call stories of Jesus and the first disciples as told by the gospel writer John. This Sunday (Epiphany 3 A), we will hear more call stories as told by the gospel writer, Matthew. Jesus is at the shoreline of the Sea of Galilee and extends a call to the sons of Zebedee (brothers ~Simon Peter and Andrew). "Follow me, and I will make you fish for people. Immediately they left their nets and followed him." His search for followers continues, leading him to another set of brothers, the sons of Zebedee, James and John. They, too, were called and left immediately to follow Jesus. They were fishermen and not just for sport but as a way of life. They left behind not only their nets and boat but their father, too.

They had a lot to lose by walking away from their businesses and family. I can only imagine how devastating it would have been for a father to watch his sons walk away and for him to suddenly lose his work force and his heirs to the family business.

Change. Disruption. When Jesus comes near and calls us into relationship, to be his disciples, it will bring about a change in other relationships as well. Jesus proclaimed repentance, which means a "change of mind." The kingdom of heaven has come near...in the person of Jesus Christ. We are called to turn away from the world's ways, towards God's ways. With the call to follow, Jesus also promises to "..make us fish for people." Which is to say, that God calls us and uses the gifts and dependable strengths which God gives to each and everyone in order to accomplish God's purposes.

Last year, about this time we were looking at the results of the Congregational Vitality Survey we had taken in November of 2018. We learned that we were a vital and sustainable congregation. That we should celebrate! The Strategic Planning Committee worked throughout the year to "dive deeper" into the results and to focus on some growth areas. (see the report in the Annual Report) In order for us to continue to be vital and sustainable we will need to continue to look for ways to foster deeper relationships (with Christ and among one another) and to invest in ongoing action plans to develop leadership within the life of the congregation. Calling and

mentoring leaders who are

willing to step into leadership/ ministry calls not only within the life of the congregation but also in the community.

God is still calling. God is doing a new thing. It may be disruptive or even surprising. Our relationship with God, our families, and one another will be affected. Some ways of being church will need to be

of being church will need to be left behind in order that new ways of doing God's mission can come about. For Matthew the kingdom of Heaven is like a precious treasure worth the letting go of all other treasures. We take heart and are hopeful for the future, because the One who calls will bring it all about in and through Jesus Christ

#### QR Code Read

Hello! I want to take a moment to give an update about TLC Center. We are very busy and currently at full enrollment capacity of 60 children. We have 20 staff members. Some days it feels as though we are bursting at the seams! We have rented a storage unit to help with our overflow of belongings, but it doesn't work for those things we need daily like diapers, etc. As you may know children require a lot of "stuff" to be well taken care of. We apologize if it feels we have overtaken this side of the building at times. We appreciate your understanding that providing quality child care requires a lot of equipment and space. We feel blessed that we are doing well as a business.

There is a shortage in our community of quality care – we receive multiple calls/emails/messages a week and our current wait list is for 80+ children. It is difficult to know about the increasing demand for quality childcare and not be able to help alleviate the situation.

We strive to be of the highest quality possible. To achieve this goal, we have chosen to participate in the following two programs.



- We are part of the Stars to Quality program. We are currently at a level
   Stars is a quality assurance program through the state of MT. This program has requirements that exceed the minimum standards set by state licensing requirements for childcare.
- 2. We have partnered with the Early Head Start Collaboration. We have approximately 20 slots for children who qualify for head start ages birth to three years old. The families who have children enrolled with us through Head Start receive the same benefits that all head start students receive such as health screening, family services, diapers, etc. As a benefit to participating in the Early Head Start collaboration, they provide the center with benefits that include equipment, staff trainings and quality monitoring programs. We are required to meet federal Head Start guidelines that are above state licensing requirements such as smaller staff to child ratios.

Thank you, Bethel Lutheran Church, for sharing this facility with us as we wouldn't be who we are without you.
