### FROM BISHOP-ELECT LAURIE JUNGLING

Dear Friends in Christ,



Grace and the peace of Christ be with you in your congregations and ministries as we move forward into God's calling for us during this time of transition. I have just returned from Bishop's Formation in Chicago, affectionately known as "baby bishop school." During my time in what often felt like boot camp, I was alternately overwhelmed with information and inspired by the Spirit-led work of the ELCA staff and the amazing call stories of my fellow new bishops. In all of this, I saw change happening: God-change, Spirit-change, life-renewing change.

Change often feels like a four-letter word. But without change there can be no life. God's creative work always involves transformation – change. Jesus Christ's salvation means transformation into new life –

change. The Holy Spirit, even as comforter, is a whirlwind of transformation – change. (Think Pentecost!) Christ's church is always reforming – change. My time at bishop formation opened my eyes again to the life-giving transformations that God is bringing about in the ELCA and the wider Christian Church every day.

But not all change is good. Not all change is necessary. Some change needs to take place in its proper time. So as the Montana Synod prepares for the transitions that will happen in September as I become the synod's new bishop, please let me ease any worries that may be floating about out there. First, call processes are not stopping during this time. Bp. Crist, who is still working as your bishop, and Jason are still guiding call processes forward in their normal ways. Second, the LPA program, NRIT, First Call, and the vitality, stewardship and leadership work of our DEM, Peggy Paugh Leuzinger, are still happening as planned. All of these programs and this work are necessary to the life of the church in Montana/Northern Wyoming and I have no plans to drop any of these from the synod's ministry. However, this does not mean that we won't be exploring over time new ways of doing these ministries in order to update and improve them for this time and place. Third, as mentioned in my previous post, the synod staff will continue in their roles, though again, we will be thinking about new ways to organize the staff according to our best gifts and synod resources. (Remember, always reforming!)

Finally, and most importantly, God has not stopped guiding the synod and its ministries with a grace-filled love and a will for new life. Christ has not stopped walking with us and saving us. The Holy Spirit has not stopped moving, advocating and comforting in your midst. That good news will never change! So as Jesus says to all of us, his disciples, "Be not afraid, little flock, for it is your Father's good pleasure to give you the kingdom." Let us rejoice and be glad in the new life of God's kingdom working among us and forever coming into our lives!
