The theme of this week's Vacation Bible School is Transformed Community: God's Agent of Change. The theme verse for the week was from the apostle Paul's letter to the Romans where he writes, "Do not be conformed to this world, but be transformed by the renewing of your minds, so that you may discern what is the will of God – what is good and acceptable and perfect." **Romans 12:2**

It is such a timely and relevant theme for the time in which we live as there are so many forces at work in the world to isolate and to divide us, militating against healthy forms of community. But we know that we were created by God for community. We long for deep and meaningful relationships. As the apostle Paul reminds us, we are called to be "transformed by the renewing of our minds, so that we may discern what is the will of God.." One of Bethel's four guiding principles is Christ Centered Relationships. We profess that "Everyone at Bethel is a Child of God, from the oldest to the youngest person. We embrace and extend gracious



hospitality and joyful fellowship. We believe generosity fosters joy so we are able to be stewards of all of God's good gifts, through time, talent, and treasure. We center our lives around gratitude to God for the abundant blessings of life."

During the week, we heard stories from the scriptures that teach us that God's transformed community practices radical acts of generosity, inclusion, compassion, justice, and forgiveness. Just one of the ways in which this was lived out this week was that the children made flowers and then proceeded to canvas the neighborhood around the church giving away their beautifully crafted paper flowers to our neighbors.

There is an African proverb that speaks to God's gift of community - "If you want to go fast, go alone; if you want to go far, go together." The week flew by quickly but I believe that we did go far, in the sense of our catching God's vision of a transformed community. It also took a huge effort by many in our community to experience this vision of a transformed community called Vacation Bible School. We had nearly 100 children in attendance each day throughout the week. In addition, we had six Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp Counselors, over twenty Jr. Counselors, and a large staff of dedicated adult volunteers..all who offered loving service to God in living as a transformed community... God's agents of change...proclaiming the Good News of God's generosity, inclusion, compassion, justice, and forgiveness. To that I invite you to join me in saying, "Thanks be to God!"
