Words from the Bishop: Let Us Pray

"The congregation that **prays** together, grows together." When you read this bit of wisdom and think of your congregation or ministry, what do you feel? Anxious? Afraid? Ho-hum? Excited? In her book *Thrive: Spiritual Habits of Transforming Congregations*, Montana theologian Ruth A. Fletcher lifts up **Prayer** as the first habit practiced by healthy congregations. And I think that's true for a healthy ministry and a healthy synod as well. "Prayer connects [people] to the power and presence of the Spirit that resides and among them," she writes. **Prayer**, especially today, is a crucial way that Christians enter into the living, healing, empowering presence of God.

But perhaps for this very reason, **prayer** also

frightens us. We worry that we're not saying the right words or speaking to God in the proper way. We feel awkward because we just don't know what to say and we aren't sure God is listening anyway. We fear giving up control and want to avoid the "let go, let God" that **prayer** requires.

And yet **prayer** is a wonderful gift from God. **Prayer** is a proven anxiety reducer, fear calmer, and relationship-with-God creator. **Prayer** frees us to rest in God without having to fix anything. **Prayer** inspires spiritual growth and empowers us to be God's hands and voice in the world. **Prayer** does "work"...just not always in the way we think it should. It doesn't solve our problems like a magic spell; but it does open us up to the power of God who transforms our lives –the good, the bad, and the down-right nutty – in amazing ways.

So, as we journey together through this time of discernment and transition into what it means to be Church during and post-Covid19, I call on the people of God in the Montana Synod to **PRAY**. **Pray**, as Paul suggests "without ceasing." (1 Thess 5:17) You might ask, what shall I pray for? Try this

list for starters...**Pray for** yourself first, then your congregation, then the Synod and the ELCA. Pray for an open heart and mind. Pray for wisdom and guidance. Pray for eyes to see God working in the world around you. **Pray** for ears to hear God's gospel proclaiming. **Pray for** humility and a positive attitude. **Pray** for the ability to trust, hope and love God first, then each other and yourself. Pray for neighbors, family, and friends. Pray for strangers, the "different," and yes, even enemies. (Why?! Cuz Jesus says so! Mt 5:44) Pray that "God's will be done," not "my will be done," in our lives on earth, and in heaven. Pray that God's Spirit may come among us and breathe new life into Christ's Church so

> that each member of its community may courageously fulfill God's purpose in their corner of the world.

And how might you **pray**? Well, that's finally between you and God. But here are some suggestions:

1.**Pray** with listening ears and an open heart so that you may discern the Spirit's presence in your life apart from all the other voices.

2.Start with the **prayers** you know like the Lord's Prayer or prayers that are readily at hand, like the Psalms (they are called "God's Prayerbook" for a reason).

3.**Imagination prayer**: imagine with all of your senses that you are at a scene in the Bible such as Jesus praying in Gethsemane (Luke 22:39-46) or Paul writing a letter to one of his congregations (Philippians 1:1-8). Then ask what the Spirit is saying to you as you immerse yourself in this scene.

4.**Centering prayer**: sit in complete silence with your eyes closed, breathe slowly and regularly, and focus on a word/phrase to invite God's Spirit into your midst.

5.**Contemplative prayer**: focus on something in God's creation, breathe regularly and slowly, and allow it to reveal God's purpose for you and the Church.

6.Divine reading prayer: very slowly read through a Bible passage three times, the first time for understanding the passage, the second time listening for a word or phrase that speaks to your life, the third time listening for how that phrase might guide your/our actions.

7.**Moving prayer**: pray while walking, exercising, or moving around in some way so that your body is kept busy while your spirit opens itself to God. (Ex. Labyrinth)

8.Conversational prayer: talk to God, Jesus, and/or the Spirit like you're sharing with your closest friend. Go the distance and talk out loud. If you're afraid of funny looks, put your cell phone to your ear...nobody will know the difference!

These are just a few ideas. There are infinite ways to **pray** and there is no one right way. God doesn't really care how we do it, just that we do it. And our congregations, ministries and the Synod need it! So please **pray**...and experience the power of the Holy Spirit transforming us in exciting ways.

BETHEL LUTHERAN CHURCH CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS MAY 12, 2020


Bethel Lutheran Council met with a zoom conference at 6:30 pm. Here are some highlights of that meeting:

- Council voted to make pay a \$30,000 payment on our building note. We are very blessed to be able to make this generous payment towards our building note!
- Our janitor, Ed Murphy, after 8 years of service, has decided to end his employment at Bethel. We are so very grateful for all of his hard work and service over the years and we wish him well. We will look into hiring a new staff person to fill this positon.
- The IELB, our companion synod in Bolivia is in need of help with food. The Synod has set a goal to raise \$3500 by the end of May. The council voted to have Bethel Lutheran Church donate \$500 beyond the congregational giving to the Bolivian Hunger.
- We also discussed some guidelines for reconvening public worship.
- Bishop Jungling joined us to talk about Pastor Steve's retirement, and inform us about an interim pastor
 and the plans for moving ahead with the call process. The Synod is there to support us. The Bishop did a
 wonderful job of reassuring us that we are not alone! Pastor Trina Johnston has been asked to serve as
 our interim pastor, the council will meet with her and, if both parties are willing, Trina will be put under
 contract for service

Bethel Lutheran Church Church Council Reopening Guidelines

We will still be offering a live stream of the service for those who wish to worship from home.

Guidelines:

- Front doors will be propped open and only entrance into the Church
- Masks will be <u>required</u> and we have some available to parishioners.
- A table is at the front doors with hand sanitizer, masks and tissues for your use.
 Ushers will be there to assist with masks and help people find seats.
- Physical distancing of 6 feet will be observed.
- Holy communion will be offered at a later date. We will be announcing prior to Sunday worship when we resume.
- Windows and doors will be opened to increase air circulation.
- Signs on the restroom doors should be used to indicate if you are in the bathroom in an effort to keep the 6 feet physical distance.
- The Gathering Place doors will be closed and sign posted as well as west side doors will remain locked to prevent cross contamination to the TLC Daycare.
- The kitchen, Fellowship Hall and back office hall doors will be closed.
- · Hospitality area will be closed.
- An offering tray is set up as you enter Bethel and will not be passed during the offering plates.
- We will pass the peace in a no-contact fashion.
- Sanctuary will be cleaned with disinfect cleaner after each Sunday worship service.

Please consider the following before you return to worship:

- Have you traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone who has traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone with flu-like symptoms in the past 30 days?
- Have you had any of these symptoms:
 - Fever over 100.4
 - Persistent cough
 - Shortness of breath
 - Sudden loss of taste or smell

If you answered YES to any of these questions, please do not enter and contact your health care provider.

Our Companions in Bolivia--Who is my neighbor?

Covid-19 is reminding us that we are all connected across the globe, for better or for worse. Congregations in the Montana Synod are working hard to find ways to continue to care for our neighbors--through food banks, homeless shelters, children's programs, distribution of masks. The congregations of the Bolivian Evangelical Lutheran Church, one of our companion synods, are also finding ways to serve their neighbors. But they need help. Bolivia is the poorest country in Latin America, and our churches there are made up of the poorest of the poor. Yet even in their own time of need, they are sharing with their neighbors.

The IELB has contacted the Montana Synod and requested our assistance in helping them feed their neighbors and provide other Covid-19-related assistance. Bishop Laurie Jungling asked me to head up the effort to raise \$3500 for our companions in Bolivia.

It would be great if we could make this a Pentecost offering, using the month of May to collect funds. Please remember our fellow Christians in Bolivia and give generously.

We are taking lead from the Montana Synod and ask you to do one of these 4 things:

- Pray for the people of Bolivia
- Consider a personal or family gift
- Bethel is will be considering a congregational gift at our next Council meeting on May 12th.
- Share this request with others you know who have a heart for these neighbors


Pastor Presidente German shared the following pictures from the Lake and Viacha Districts in Bolivia.





Family Promise


