A Good, Good-bye

There comes a time when pastors say good-bye to their congregations. Retirement is one of those times. The good-byes... sometimes they are expected and sometimes they come unexpectedly.

In her book, *The Graceful Exit*, Mary C. Lindberg writes about the experience of a pastor's leave taking from a call - a congregation. "... before we (the pastor) steps out, God invites us in – into Word and Sacrament, into relationships, into our offices, and into our emotions about leaving. Within all these areas we look for answers to the big question we suddenly face: What makes a good good-bye?"



I'm living this question. Trying my best to answer it in my own way together with you. There is no easy way to say good-bye, especially as we live amidst a pandemic. It saddens me to think that I may not be able to say good-bye in person to many of you in light of these times. A lot of us can say that we strongly dislike having to say good-byes, so we avoid doing so at all costs. Some say, "I won't say good-bye. I'll just say... see you later." I have used that line before but not now. For a good good-bye for me is making the time to express what this call..this relationship has meant to me. What you have meant to me. It finds expression through the telling of stories. Lifting up memories of living in community (the sad and the joyous times) and expressing our gratitude to God who called and knit us together through Christ, in love. I also realize that with a good good-bye there will be the acknowledgment of separation and along with it, loss and grief. For me there has been anticipatory grief, for I know that the nature of our relationship will change. I will continue to live in the community of Great Falls but will no longer be your pastor. That will take some getting used to for all of us, myself and my wife, Kaye, included. At the last Council meeting, Bishop Laurie Jungling spoke to the Church Council about an interim pastor who will be coming to serve at Bethel and not long after my retirement begins. Stayed tuned to the Council's communications with you about what is in store.

In the meantime, I will intentionally work on a good good-bye and through the many and various ways we can do that in the time we have been given. It might be safe visit at the church. A phone or a Zoom call. It might be an email or a card. It might be a "porch visit" at your home or mine. You will continue to be in my prayers and I ask you to continue to keep me and Kaye in your prayers.

School Food Delivery:

Thank you to everyone who donated food for the schools. A delivery was made to the Food Bank to designate for the school pantries. Unfortunately the Food Bank no longer has specific shelfs for the High Schools as some of the other agencies receiving food from the food bank thought the schools were getting "special" treatment. The food bank is still distributing food to all the schools from their over-all inventory. They promised me that 60% of all their food does go to the schools. So I went ahead and delivered our school designated food as planned.

My thoughts are, until the schools reopen in the fall, we should discontinue collecting food specifically for the schools at Bethel. What I would hope is that you would participate in other ways:

- 1. Continue to donate food to FISH or directly to the Food Bank.
- 2. Give a dollar donation to <u>Great Falls Public School Foundation</u> designated for school food cupboards. This can be done online or mailed to 1100 4th Street South, Great Falls, MT. 59404
- 3. Contact a school of your choice and see if they are accepting food through the summer and deliver the food at your convenience.
- 4. Continue to Pray that no child goes hungry during this uncertain time.

As we hear more about the Fall school schedules and/or their food needs we will keep you posted. In the meantime Stay Safe. Stay Healthy. Stay fed. God Bless.

At Bethel we have a lovely group of ladies that meet twice a month and create prayer cloths, prayer shawls and now prayer quilts. A 2 inch by 2 inch pocket "quilt" that contains within it a cross. These are easily put in pockets or purses and gives a reminder that you are loved and prayed for.

Bethel Lutheran Church Church Council Reopening Guidelines

We will still be offering a live stream of the service for those who wish to worship from home.

Guidelines:

- Front doors will be propped open and only entrance into the Church
- Masks will be <u>required</u> and we have some available to parishioners.
- A table is at the front doors with hand sanitizer, masks and tissues for your use.
 Ushers will be there to assist with masks and help people find seats. We ask that would you also sign the welcome pad as you come in.
- Physical distancing of 6 feet will be observed.
- Holy communion will be offered at a later date. We will be announcing prior to Sunday worship when we resume.
- Windows and doors will be opened to increase air circulation.
- Signs on the restroom doors should be used to indicate if you are in the bathroom in an effort to keep the 6 feet physical distance.
- The Gathering Place doors will be closed and sign posted as well as west side doors will remain locked to prevent cross contamination to the TLC Daycare.
- The kitchen, Fellowship Hall and back office hall doors will be closed.
- Hospitality area will be closed.
- An offering plate is set up as you enter Bethel and will not be passed during the the service.
- We will pass the peace in a no-contact fashion.
- Sanctuary will be cleaned with disinfect cleaner after each Sunday worship service.

Please consider the following before you return to worship:

- Have you traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone who has traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone with flu-like symptoms in the past 30 days?
- Have you had any of these symptoms:
 - Fever over 100.4
 - Persistent cough
 - Shortness of breath
 - Sudden loss of taste or smell

If you answered YES to any of these questions, please do not enter and contact your health care provider.

Our Companions in Bolivia--Who is my neighbor?

Covid-19 is reminding us that we are all connected across the globe, for better or for worse. Congregations in the Montana Synod are working hard to find ways to continue to care for our neighbors--through food banks, homeless shelters, children's programs, distribution of masks. The congregations of the Bolivian Evangelical Lutheran Church, one of our companion synods, are also finding ways to serve their neighbors. But they need help. Bolivia is the poorest country in Latin America, and our churches there are made up of the poorest of the poor. Yet even in their own time of need, they are sharing with their neighbors.

The IELB has contacted the Montana Synod and requested our assistance in helping them feed their neighbors and provide other Covid-19-related assistance. Bishop Laurie Jungling asked me to head up the effort to raise \$3500 for our companions in Bolivia.


