Whose Table Is This?

A number of years ago, Pastor Justin Eller, former ELCA Global Missionary serving in IELB (Ev. Lutheran Church of Bolivia), was on furlough and leading worship at Bethel. During the children's message he asked the children, "Whose table is this (pointing to the altar behind him)? In unison the children replied, "Pastor Steve's!" Following the roar of laughter, Pastor Eller went on to explain that it was the Lord's Table (not mine) and that Pastor Steve was called by God to preside at the Lord's Table.

Not just children, but all ages can and do naturally associate a church with a Pastor and/or a people. The church is about relationships, after all. The people of Israel were known as God's



people. Jesus' followers were known as his disciples. When the time came, the promised Holy Spirit came on that day called Pentecost. From this Sunday's reading from Acts, "Without warning there was a sound like a strong wind, gale force - -no one could tell where it came from. It filled the whole building. Then like a wildfire, the Holy Spirit spread through their ranks and they started speaking in a number of different languages as the Spirit prompted them." Acts 2, The Message. On the Day of Pentecost, God's church is born.

The word *church* means "to be called out." Bethel's Mission Statement is short and to the point. God is both the subject and the verb. God is chief actor, activator and sender. God call us. God transforms us. God sends us. Bethel. The church is God's just as the Lord's Table is God's. One of Bethel's Belief Statements is "God works through the church by the power of the Holy Spirit to build relationships which are guided by generosity, hospitality, and forgiveness." We are all witnesses to what the Spirit of the living God can and does do in us and through us. We have stories to share.

During the next month, the time which we have to share together before I transition into retirement, I will be writing and preaching on Bethel's Mission Statement, Belief Statements and Guiding Principles. I hope that, in doing so, that we will be reminded that Bethel is God's church...it always has been and always will be. "God works through the church by the power of the Holy Spirit to build relationships which are guided by generosity, hospitality and forgiveness." I will be sharing stories of relationships, and shared ministry, which God has made happen in and through us. I invite you into the telling of those stories. I hope that in the midst of our goodbyes..our story telling...that we will be able to celebrate this and to know that God....who CALLS US. TRANSFORMS US AND SENDS US will be the glorified. Bethel's Vacation Bible School is cancelled for this summer and we look forward to Summer 2021.



Bethel Lutheran Church Church Council Reopening Guidelines

We will still be offering a live stream of the service for those who wish to worship from home.

Guidelines:

- Front doors will be propped open and only entrance into the Church
- Masks will be <u>required</u> and we have some available to parishioners.
- A table is at the front doors with hand sanitizer, masks and tissues for your use. Ushers will be there to assist with masks and help people find seats.
- Physical distancing of 6 feet will be observed.
- Holy communion will be offered at a later date. We will be announcing prior to Sunday worship when we resume.
- Windows and doors will be opened to increase air circulation.
- Signs on the restroom doors should be used to indicate if you are in the bathroom in an effort to keep the 6 feet physical distance.
- The Gathering Place doors will be closed and sign posted as well as west side doors will remain locked to prevent cross contamination to the TLC Daycare.
- The kitchen, Fellowship Hall and back office hall doors will be closed.
- Hospitality area will be closed.
- An offering tray is set up as you enter Bethel and will not be passed during the offering plates.
- We will pass the peace in a no-contact fashion.
- Sanctuary will be cleaned with disinfect cleaner after each Sunday worship service.

Please consider the following before you return to worship:

- Have you traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone who has traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone with flu-like symptoms in the past 30 days?
- Have you had any of these symptoms:
 - Fever over 100.4
 - Persistent cough
 - Shortness of breath
 - Sudden loss of taste or smell

If you answered YES to any of these questions, please do not enter and contact your health care provider.




GLOBAL COMPANION PRAYER SERVICE

Thanks for your support of our Bolivian Neighbors


