# TRANSFORMING COMMUNITY!

We are so excited to be planning and preparing for Vacation Bible School Day Camp this year!

Six counselors from Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp will be leading a high energy week of games, bible lessons, songs and worship. We are honored to be able to offer this outstanding camp to our community free of charge. But as you know, it takes a village and there are several ways we need your support to make this camp happen.

First a little about VBS for those who haven't attended before. For campers going into first grade through sixth grade, the days begin at 9:00 AM with worship and singing in the Sanctuary. Then the campers are split into their age groups to do one of three counselor-lead activities bible study, small group team building and games, or crafts. They rotate so each group participates in each activity throughout the day. Snack is provided by the camp and we break for brown bag lunch (camper provided) at noon. This will be our last Circle/Bible Study for the season. We will meet in June for a family picnic/get together and then take the months of July and August off, starting again in September.



baptism:

This Sunday, in worship, eleven eighth graders will make affirmation of the promises God made to them in Jesus Christ at their baptism. The service is called Affirmation of Baptism or as most of us life-long Lutherans have referred to as the Rite of Confirmation. Over the past two years (grades 7 & 8), the bible study time during Logos, has focused on the promises which each will make during the service. "Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in holy



- to live among God's faithful people
- to hear the word of God and share in the Lord's Supper
- to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed
- to serve all people, following the example of Jesus
- to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?"

(Evangelical Lutheran Worship, page 236).

At the conclusion of their eighth grade Logos/Confirmation time of instruction, each one is asked to write a statement of faith ~ reflecting on each of the promises or intentions listed above. Most find this a stress-full assignment. I assure them that there is no "right" answer that I am looking for, only their thoughts and feelings about faith and daily life at this point in their journey of life/faith. I also assure them that this is not an exam and that there is no pass/fail when it comes to living in the community of faith. My hope is that there will be a faith conversation between youth and parent(s) that will take place and hopefully will be ongoing. When their statement of faith is completed, a meeting is scheduled at which youth, parents and I discuss their statement of faith and about next steps in the journey of faith. Might they continue to wrestle with life's big questions and how their faith speaks to them? Might they continue to be a part of the Logos High School group? Gather with the worshipping community to hear the Word and share in the Sacraments? Might they spend a week at Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp this Summer? Might they continue to discern what their dependable, God-given strengths are and see the ways that they are or could be sharing them in service to their congregation, their neighbor, the world?

These are a lot of questions to ask. Some big promises and intentions to make. Responsibilities to take on in being a follower of Jesus Christ. All which leads to each of their responses: "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me." Each "I do," to live in the promises of baptism will be dependent on God's help and guidance. Each "I do," will need the power of the Holy Spirit each day to empower them to affirm and live according to the covenant (promises) God made with them in Holy Baptism. Each "I do," will need the ongoing support of parents, baptismal sponsors, the congregation, through their prayers and encouragement.
