WHO HAS THE INSIDE TRACK?


Don't we all like to be part of the "in-crowd?" How often do we read about parents signing up their young child for the "right" kindergarten, moving into neighborhoods with the "best" school system, going to the "best" university? Once in a while ethics may be put on the back-burner in the attempt to be part of that in-crowd. Over the past few months we read in the news about Hollywood parents "buying" their children's admission to universities.

In preparation for this article, I found the following quote in ELCA's Sundays and Seasons (www.sundaysandseasons.com) for this Sunday. "Samaritans were ethnically and religiously distinct from the Judeans. It is characteristic of the human phenomenon of religion that it embraces the insiders in the protection of their beliefs and distances itself from those who are other. Thus often religion gives its adherents a secure identity in contrast with

the outsider who is somehow dangerous."

Unfortunately, this is even true within the wider Lutheran world. For some congregations, participation in Holy Communion may require membership in a specific Lutheran body or prior approval by the congregation's pastor. However, I never ran into this in any ELCA congregation over the past 40 years nor with any Protestant military chaplain.

Luke's gospel reading for Sunday tells the story of Jesus cleansing ten lepers (Luke 17:11-19). We only know



As the lepers were told to show themselves to the priests, one might assume, that the 9 lepers were Judeans who were originally part of the insiders. Their illness made them outsiders, and Jesus' healing returned them to being insiders. Confusing? Yes. As insiders, they may have felt it unnecessary to return to Jesus. Could they have praised God in front of the priests? We will never know.

Jesus does not ask if the 10 are insiders or outsiders. For Jesus, healing is not based on that. Healing is much more than restoring someone from an illness. A prayer from "Christ In Our Home" some 3 decades ago makes the point,

THURSDAY — Healing — In this broken world, Lord, bring us your healing power, and work through us to sooth pains and mend wounds. Create in us a mending nature that can heal the hurts we see in those around us. Where there is racism, injustice or un-love, help us to be your healing hands. And heal us, too, Lord, that we may heal others. Amen
