## BETHEL LUTHERAN CHURCH COUNCIL MEETING HIGHLIGHTS NOVEMBER 10, 2020

Bethel Lutheran Church Council met on Tuesday, November 10 by zoom. Here are some highlights from that meeting:

- •The Call Committee announced the Mission Site Profile has been submitted to the Synod. It has been accepted and we have received a profile number.
- Technology updates continue to be completed, as does the ADA compliant front door opener
- We will revisit the COVID-19 Guidelines in the Bethel Notes, so the community and congregation remain safe. At this point, in-person services will follow the school districts closures. When the church does not hold in-person worship services, we will not have other organizations hold meetings in the church. This is to reflect our support of the precautions we are using to keep the congregation safe and healthy.
- The Council discussed and agreed that we should not have in-person worship on Christmas Eve. We will work together to provide a prerecorded service that families may view whenever they wish.
- The Congregational Budget Forum date was set for January 17, 2021. The Congregational Annual Meeting will be January 24, 2021.
- Council voted to designate the Giving Tree donations to the Alliance for Youth in the 2020 holiday season. To view the October 2020 Council Meeting Minutes in their entirety, please go to

### A MESSAGE FROM PASTOR TRINA

Dear sisters and brothers in Christ,

At the November 10 Council Meeting it was agreed that while the Great Falls Public Schools are engaged in remote learning to help stop the spread of Covid-19, Bethel Lutheran will also cease all inperson gatherings. We do this as a show of support for and love of neighbor. We will have in-person worship this Sunday, but beginning Monday, November 16 our gatherings will cease.

We will continue our online worship during this time, so please join us live at 9:30 on Sunday mornings, or watch it later in the week on YouTube. The installation of our new audio and visual equipment is complete and will be in use Sunday, November 22, so we are hoping for enhanced quality in our online service. Please shoot us an email and let us know what you think.

Also, over the last month, the ELCA pastors in Great Falls have been discussing how to plan for Christmas Eve worship in the time of Covid. Those services are typically our largest of the year, featuring the singing of many beloved carols and the lighting (and blowing out) of individual candles, all while tightly packed in with the many visitors and guests joining those who regularly worship. None of that is possible during Covid, and so we will be having pre-recorded Christmas Eve services this year that you may watch at home with family at a time that best suits your holiday plans. I know this is a disappointment...just one more treasured and meaningful tradition lost to the pandemic this long year. But by planning ahead we should be able to produce a high-quality service with more music than we can enjoy in person. Look for more information on this in the weeks to come.

Things won't always be like this, beloved of the Lord. The time will come when we will once again gather freely, sing with gusto, hug our Bethel family and not have to do it all through masks and at a distance. But in the meantime, please do whatever you can to stay healthy yourself and to protect the health of our neighbors. ## **Alliance for Youth Resource Center**

The YRC Drop-in Center is a first point of contact that provides an informal atmosphere to attract and engage youth who are disadvantaged and/or homeless. Key features of the YRC include:

- Low- or No-Barrier: Foster a welcoming, safe, non-judgmental environment, with limited requirements, conveniently located near public transportation.
- **Meet Basic Needs:** Provide easy access to food, laundry, shower and clothes. Provide access to Internet, phones, and lockers for storage of belongings. Scheduled visiting medical staff can provide optional basic healthcare and first aid.
- Trauma-Informed Care: Despite the informal atmosphere, staff is trained and ready to provide crisis intervention, conflict resolution and supporting services. It is especially important that staff be trained or have access to services specifically for LGBTQ and/or tribal youth, who are disproportionately represented among youth who are experiencing homelessness in our state.
- **Positive Youth Development:** Staff is trained to develop the youth's competence, confidence, connection and contribution.
- Youth Focused: Create a positive and healthy peer network for youth, access to caring adults and engage in youth-centered programming.
- Service Coordination: Operate as a central hub for services, such as medical, dental, behavioral health care, substance abuse treatment, housing search support and advocacy. Staff can help with documentation and facilitates school re-engagement or connection to adult basic education or workforce development programs. Drop-in centers operate in tandem with mobile "street" outreach programs, family engagement services, emergency shelters and transitional housing.

Our Vulnerable Youth in Great Falls are Struggling

- More than 475 children in Great Falls are homeless at some point during the year
- More than 600 children are in foster care in Cascade County, more than double the state average
- 70% of foster care placements are due to substance abuse and of these 80% involved Meth
- 25% of the graduating class of Paris Gibson Education Center lived on their own
- 30.8% of 10th graders reported seriously considering attempting suicide in the past 12 months
- More than 15,000 pounds of food are given to high school students annually
- Many of the social services offered to

The new 2021 Daily Texts have arrived and are ready for pick up in the Narthex.



## Words from the Bishop: Patience is a Virtue

During my brief time in the military, an often-used phrase was "Hurry up and wait!" We were always hurrying to get somewhere and then when we got there, we'd have to wait. We'd get rousted out of bed at five in the morning, rush around to dress and get our beds made, run outside, and then stand in formation for a half hour waiting for someone in charge to show up. We'd run to the cafeteria and then have to wait in line forever to get our food. The lines were the worst because standing in line always meant waiting for something without having anything else to do but stand in a line. It was easy to lose patience with

the whole system standing in that boring line. But I'm guessing that all that "hurry up and wait" was trying to teach us the patience often needed during times of battle.

These days it's hard to have patience about anything. We live in a hurry-up

culture, where we are promised that we will "get it now, get it fast and get it our way." And it is amazing how many ways that promise is kept. But if that promise isn't kept, our anxiety skyrockets and we act out in unloving and destructive ways to ourselves and others. We're seeing this even as I write while we still wait for election results to be made official in our nation. Patience, it seems, is no longer a virtue in our world.

But for followers of Christ, patience is still an

important part of the fruit of the Spirit. (Gal 5:22) In fact, the words patient, patience and patiently are used 35 times in the New Testament, each time as an aspect of Christ-like love. Again and again, followers of Christ are called to be patient, especially as we await the coming of Christ.

Patience, however, does not mean to sit and do nothing as we wait. We see this truth in the parable from the gospel this week as the first two servants go forth and invest the gift they'd been given even as they await the return of their Lord while the third servant does as little as possible.

(Mt 25:14-30)

Patience means to be active in this world, living in hope-filled faith in God, taking faith-filled risks that are responsive to the Spirit's presence in our lives. Patience is daring to stay in the place we are, as hard as it can be sometimes, and

as it can be sometimes, and seeking God's glimpses of life in the situation while trusting that something hidden will become manifest to us. It does not mean staying stuck in death-filled places where there is no hope, but unless one's life is truly at stake, it does means sticking it out as we live God's activity in the present world, nurturing the times in the same way a mother nurtures a child growing in her.

This kind of Holy Spirit presence, waiting yet active in the already/not yet, can't be done alone. We need the support, encouragement, love and forgiveness of God and of one another.



And how might we encourage one another in patient living in Christ? Here are three ideas for practicing patience together. First, by simply breathing with one another in silent meditation. Second, by praying to God with each other for the patience we need. And third, by practicing gratitude, intentionally looking for, naming out loud with someone, and thanking God for what God is already doing in our lives. Remember that patience in Christ requires practice: the more we do it, the better we get at it.

So as the book of James reminds us: "Be patient, therefore, beloved, until the coming of the Lord. The farmer waits for the precious crop from the earth, being patient with it until it receives the early and the late rains. You also must be patient. Strengthen your hearts, for the coming of the Lord is near." (James 5:7-8)
