
# BETHEL NOTES

### A Word From The Bishop: Thanksgiving During A Pandemic

(transcribed from online video from the Montana Synod weekly online newsletter)

Good morning, I am sitting out on my patio today working from home due to office closure because of Covid.

Covid cases are rising astronomically here in Cascade County as they may be in your counties as well.

I have a scripture reading today from Ephesians 5. Paul writes:

but be filled with the Spirit, as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks to God the

Father at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus Christ.

How do we give thanks during a pandemic?

We are coming up on the Thanksgiving holiday and it is not going to be the same as it usually has been. We are not going to be able to gather with our families and watch football and go shopping together in the ways we have before. We

are not going to be able to gather for large worship opportunities or go to various places where we have parties. We are just not going to be able to do that, so how do we give thanks during a pandemic, when Paul says we are supposed to give thanks at all times and for everything, in the name of Jesus.

A lot of people have a tradition around Thanksgiving, around the meal sometimes it is around the dessert table or something like that where people name the things that they are grateful for. The things that happened during the year, the people they are grateful for.

Others have a practice of putting together a gratitude journal and every night naming the things during the day that they are grateful for.

Others continue to ask God through prayer and through hymns and through songs to inspire in them a grateful heart, a grateful mind, a grateful spirit. Praying to God for that attitude of gratitude that is more than just a thought or an idea, but fills our very selves.

Perhaps we need to go beyond these things this year as we are not able to celebrate this

Thanksgiving holiday in the way we might want because of the increasing numbers in our state and in our nation of Covid.

Perhaps we need to give thanks to God through our actions. The actions of our body and our will.

Perhaps we need to give thanks to God for our healthcare workers and ease their burdens.

Perhaps we need to give thanks to God for our teachers and students, who now many of whom are remote learning.

Perhaps we need to give thanks to God for public servants, the county health officials who are offering guidance to us during this time.

Perhaps we need to give thanks for the first responders, the law enforcement, the paramedics, the fire department who still have to go out amongst us and the pandemic.

The new 2021 Daily Texts have arrived and are ready for pick up in the Narthex.


