

Personal Reflections on 2020 and Beyond

Some 30 years ago I ran into a prayer that I found in *Christ In Our Home*, a quarterly ELCA devotional. This prayer had and has some relevance during the Covid-19 times.

Patience

Lord, you know how impatient we are. We want it all, and we want it right now! And this breeds all sorts of unrest within us. We are afraid we will run out of time before we get all that we want. We know that this is a sorry attitude. Grant us, Lord, the virtue of patience, patience with you and patience with others. Help us to see that your schedule may be quite different from ours, and that all you have to give us will be given in your good time. Amen

Who could have known how Covid-19 would affect the year 2020 during the first quarter of the year? As infection numbers increased progressively, we wondered how those increases would affect the religious life?

I was surprised by the impatience within whole religious communities after the lockdown closed the church buildings. Some groups insisted that churches remain open like other essential services. It was as if God could only be found in the church building on Sunday mornings.

Once Bethel reopened for worship there was an emphasis on masks, social distancing, and reduced capacity. It was not clear if other congregations took the same approach.



Just drive through Great Falls on any given Sunday morning and look at the number of cars in the church parking lots. Some parking lots are empty but some are as full as ever. I'm still struggling with the impatience displayed.

A short Bethel review

Quickly, Covid-19 affected church services and other church activities. After a week or so of in-person Lenten suppers, they were cancelled. In-person Holy Week services were cancelled. The annual Summer Youth Camp was cancelled.

To assist congregations in Great Falls, Croxford Funeral Home opened their Chapel for streamed ELCA Sunday services. Was it perfect? No, but it was a good first step.

Moves were implemented to stream worship services from Bethel's sanctuary. In addition, there were inperson Sunday worship services that followed clear social distancing guidelines. It took some time to improve the quality of the video/sound stream.

Long-term Pastor Steve retired from Bethel. 14 plus years of ministry at Bethel made a huge impact on many. I recall how his hospital visitation ministry affected Terree and I very positively when we were patients at Benefis over the years.

Currently interim Pastor Trina offers Bible studies on Zoom. Terree and I enjoy the weekly Wednesday study a lot.

This year, all Great Falls ELCA congregations offered taped Christmas Eve services.

Zoom, FaceTime, Duo, You Tube and other applications have become electronic avenues to keep in touch.

Looking forward to 2021

Patience should be the mantra for 2021. We don't know if business-as-usual or normal will return to our congregation.

What will be the definition of *normal*? Maybe change or adjustments, major and minor, would benefit the congregation. I do not envy the call committee's task of calling a new pastor to Bethel in these times. *Thinking about it, this is already the third decade of the 21st century*. What will be the look and feel of the congregation in the rest of 21st century?

There are still many issues that affect the Great Falls community. How will we now address food insecurity for many? How will we address housing issues for many? How can congregations and specifically Bethel help the community?

Questions and no quick answers.

Let us walk patiently into 2021.



We raised a total of \$2857.82 for The Alliance for Youth Recourse Center table and chair sets. That will purchase a total of 10.8 total sets!


