




This year she was chosen to cheer for the East West Shrine game as well as being chosen for the CMR Hall of Fame 2021 for Cheerleading.

Profile for the Proposed Nominee As Pastor for Bethel Lutheran Church



Bethel Lutheran's Call Committee started our call process in August, 2020. Our call committee envisioned a system where we would partner with our congregation in the selection process of our new pastor. From the information gathered from our congregational vitality survey and the information we gathered during our open and requested feedback period, we were able to determine the wide variety of needs that would be the best path forward.

Your committee was fully committed to interviewing women, men, people of color and all ethnicities, as potential pastors of Bethel Lutheran Church. Our efforts were put into a process, that would ensure Bethel would reap with joy, the gifts and graces all properly credentialed candidates could bring to our ministry setting.

After diligent work and via unanimous decision, the call committee is <u>very excited</u> to present <u>Pastor</u> <u>Jessica Obrecht</u> as our choice to serve as Bethel's next Pastor!

Pastor Jessica Obrecht is currently serving at a two-point parish, which includes St. Paul Lutheran Church and Grace Lutheran Church in Fairfield, Montana. She has been serving there as a rostered Pastor since 2017. She has been serving in the Montana Synod since 2014.

Pastor Jessica completed her internship between both Peace Lutheran Church and St. John's United in Billings, Montana. She received her Master of Divinity in 2017, from the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. In 2012, she received her Bachelor of Arts degree in Religion/Religious Studies, along with a Bachelor of Arts in Social Work, from Concordia College in Moorhead, Minnesota.

She continues with ongoing training including, but not limited to: Boundaries Training, Resiliency for Church Leaders, Festival of Homiletics, Communicating in Faith, In Memory of Her- Voices of Biblical Women, and her upcoming training in Religious Giving.

Her area of expertise include: Building a Sense of Community; Global Services; Teaching; Innovation/ Creativity and Preaching/Worship Leadership.

Areas of Strength are: Pastoral Care and Visitation: Outdoor Ministry; Ecumenical Work; Recruit and Equip Leaders and Counseling/Social Work

Pastor Jessica has served in Malaysia as a Young Adult in Global Mission through the ELCA, Global Mission board, and the South Africa Companion Synod Advisory Team. She currently serves as a Synod Council Member, ELCA world Hunger Coordinator, a member of the South Africa Companion Synod Advisory Team and a member of the Board of Directors at Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp.

Pastor Jessica strengths include teaching. She states this is one of her favorite parts of being a Pastor. She had taught adult classes on Global Church and the book of Revelations, mission and covenant

making. She loves to teach confirmation class. Her strengths include innovation and creativity. She believes one of her most important gifts is the ability to be flexible. She is creative and adventurous. She is willing to try new things and re-envision ways that can make ministries more vibrant. She believes that preaching and worship leadership is probably her top gift as a Pastor. She feels confident and relaxed leading worship, and prefers to preach without notes, so that she can talk and engage with a congregation, rather than talk at a congregation. She loves to work with the musicians to plan and enhance worship and believes in the power of music in worship. Pastor Jessica, believes that children should be an integral part of any church's worship life.

Pastor Jessica's three most prominent themes that are strongly evident in her speaking, teaching, leading and living are:

Grace Oriented: She believes that God is continually transforming us as individuals and communities in this lifelong endeavor of discipleship

Community Oriented: In the midst of our lives in faith, we NEED each other and we NEED God.

Christ Centered: She believes that the teachings, life, death, and resurrection of Jesus Christ may be the most exciting and life-giving witness she has ever encountered.

Pastor Jessica has stated she is a passionate leader who is confident in God's active work in the world and the life-giving nature of the Gospel. She feels called to serve God's church and God's world through the work of creating relationships, building up communities, and having international conversations about faith and life.

Pastor Jessica is currently in a long-term, romantic relationship with a woman. She understands that this may be difficult for some members of our congregation, however we have expressed to her that Bethel has a belief and commitment that all are WELCOME through our doors. Her relationship status is not central to her ministry as a Pastor, her preaching style, or her teaching focus.


