Awoman finds healing by touching Jesus' cloak, and a girl is restored to life when he takes her by the hand. In both cases a boundary is crossed: in Jesus' time the hemorrhaging woman was considered ritually unclean, polluting others by her touch, and anyone who touched a corpse also became unclean. In Mark's gospel Jesus breaks down barriers, from his first meal at a tax collector's house to his last breath on the cross as the temple curtain is torn in two. We dare to touch Jesus in our "uncleanness" and to live as a community that defines no one as an outsider.

Hello Bethel!

This past weekend I had the opportunity to go to Glacier National Park and help to open Granite Park Chalet. The chalet sits atop a mountain trail that is four miles long with around a 2500-foot elevation gain. It is steep, and the hike is a strenuous one. Once you arrive at the top though, the 360 degree view is worth every step. As I sat atop that mountain I was reminded of Psalm 121, and the Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp song that paraphrases Psalm 121. "I life my eyes up, unto the mountains. Where does my help come from?" the song goes. The Psalm is entitled "Assurance of God's Protection" in the NRSV. I remember singing this song with vigor as a child and looking up to the mountains across Flathead Lake and somehow knowing that God was there. Mountainous places are one of those holy spaces for me. It seems like everything slows down and I can center myself, quiet my soul, and listen more fully for God's voice and guidance in my life. Over the years, I remember waiting both as a child and as an adult, for those moments where I could run away to the mountains. As I arrived in those mountainous places my heart would burst with joy and relief, and I would begin to let my guard down and search for divine connection.

There was only one real problem with this deep connection I had with the mountains over time. At some point I had convinced myself that the mountains were the only place that I could ever slow down, center, and connect with God. The only place God's protection and love could possibly strike me deeply was amid my favorite natural beauty. Or so I told myself. Over the years I lived in places like Havre, Fargo, ND, Columbus, OH, Chicago, IL, and even Malaysia! The mountains were not there. But God was. God continued to work and to show up in my life and in the lives of those around me. Slowly, I began to find the little places that were holy and sacred in my everyday life. The definition of sacrament is something ordinary that becomes extraordinary. Simple bread and wine have the body and blood of Christ in, with, and through them and all of a sudden, they are anything but ordinary. As people of faith, we of course are invited to experience God's incredible presence, love, and protection in the extraordinary moments of life such as my moment of standing atop a mountain outside of Granite Park Chalet. That is not the only place we find our Creator's handiwork though. We encounter God each day in the ordinary moments. In those encounters we see a glimpse of the extraordinary Kingdom that God is creating in, through, and around us. So where are your sacred places? The places where you feel the most connected to God, to yourself, and to the world? It is good to have those places! In addition, though, where might be the everyday ordinary places that you encounter God and don't even realize it most days? Where are those sacramental moments in the days that seem the most mundane for you? Keep an eye out this week for the ordinary becoming extraordinary, and bask in the abundance of God's love and presence in all places of our lives.

He has taught Bible, Greek, and Christian spirituality for 22 years at Trinity Lutheran College in Washington.
