Pastor Steve's Message

Everything Has It's Time

The writer of wisdom says, "For everything there is a season, and a time for every matter under heaven: ⁶ a time to seek, and a time to lose; a time to keep, and a time to throw away; **Ecclesiastes 3: 1,6 NRSV**

In this familiar passage, the writer puts opposites together: seeking and losing; keeping and throwing away. It says that these experiences are ones which God puts together, in God's time and not ours. God inhabits all our life experiences, giving them meaning.

As we mark the time of the church, we begin a new season this coming Sunday - the season called Advent. The word Advent means "coming" or "arrival." In the church's liturgy, Advent begins four Sundays prior to Dec. 25th The focus of the entire season is the celebration of the birth of Jesus the Christ in his First Advent, and the anticipation of the return of Christ the King in his Second Advent.

I believe that this First Sunday in Advent clearly reminds us that our time is not our own. But about that day or hour or time...(of the Lord's return) you do not know...only the Father knows. God will arrive, regardless of our readiness and our efforts to order time to our making..to our timeliness, in order to transform the time we live. So, enter into Advent time...the time God inhabits with us. A time that is not always comfortable but discomforting, even disruptive. Yet, a reorienting time, as well, that offers us the opportunity to be attentive in order to see God in our time, at work, birthing something new in us.

One of the oldest prayers of the Christian community is "Come, Lord Jesus." In the language which Jesus spoke, this prayer was not only a prayer for help in the time of need but also a welcome to the risen Christ. I invite you to join me for some Adult Forums, to take a look at the assigned texts, prayers of the day for the next three Sundays in Advent. We will begin each Sunday, after worship, and will meet for an hour together in the Fellowship Hall.

In closing, a prayer. Though you have told us to keep awake, O God, you have also blessed us with rest and sleep. Grant me such rest in the hours ahead that I awaken with eager longing for a new day, ready for you to be revealed in mundane moments and ordinary encounters. By your grace prepare me, whether awake or asleep, to greet you: in the evening, or at midnight, or at the cockcrow, or at dawn. Mark 13:35. All times are in your hands, and I, too, am in your hands, faithful God. In Jesus' name I rest and pray. Amen. 1


