


BETHEL NOTES

On Sunday, following worship, you are invited to gather in the sanctuary for Bethel's annual congregational meeting. The 2017 Annual Report is published (click here) and some printed copies will be available on a table in the back of the sanctuary. This article is meant to encourage Bethel members to make time to attend the annual meeting and of the importance of our gathering to make decisions that affect our life together.

I remember my very first annual congregational meeting at Bethel, it was in January of 2005 and held between services. As pastor of three previous congregations, and as a member of a few other congregations, I had expectations of how the annual meeting would go. What I experienced at my first Bethel annual congregational meeting, to my delight, was a well organized and led meeting at which we adopted a proposed budget, elected new council members and representatives, celebrated the congregation's life and ministry during the past year...looked forward to the new year of ministry and honored the faithful service of those in leadership. All that took place in the span of forty minutes, due to obvious time constraints, and the late service actually started on time! My take-away was that people trusted and appreciated their leadership and could embrace the decisions which were made concerning our shared life and ministry. Over the years I have served as pastor here, at annual meetings... we have celebrated a mortgage debt retirement, adopted a strategic plan, and voted to move forward with a building renovation plan, directed by the ELCA Mission Builders and to approve the funding...celebrated ministry done locally, synodically and globally. At this Sunday's annual meeting we will vote to adopt an updated Constitution and By-Laws; vote to elect new church council members; adopt the 2018 budget or as I'd like to call it a ministry funding plan; hear an update on the Mission Freedom Campaign; vote on representatives to Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp as well as voting members to the Montana Synod Assembly~ Theological Conference, held in Great Falls in June.

Annual congregational meetings have grown out of the Reformation idea of the "universal priesthood," which the Reformer Martin Luther taught and preached about. The idea of the "universal priesthood" was also synonymous with the "priesthood of all believers," and the "ministry of the laity." What it meant to most was what the laity (the people of God..the church) did in and for the church (ie. serving on a committee, organizing and leading ministries, ushering, lay assisting in worship, etc.) But our shared ministry has a much broader scope. Ministry is not limited just to what is done within the walls of the church, but in our homes, schools, workplaces, in the greater community and the world. The call to serve God by serving the neighbor is heard throughout our worship service. Just last Sunday our new members, Warren & Judy Johnson and Don & Thelma Seyfert, along with all of us, affirmed the faith and committed to "..serve all people, following the example of Jesus." A couple of Sunday's ago we sang the hymn, *The Summons* (ELW # 798) "Will you use the faith you've found to reshape the world around, through my sight and touch and sound in you and you in me?" And each Sunday we are dismissed with a charge like this one, "Go in peace. Be the light of Christ!"

Faith is connected to ministry in daily life. Our baptism into Christ Jesus is our ordination into a life of service ~ it is our calling to love the world which God so loves. Come be a part of the annual congregational meeting to celebrate our common life and ministry and to make decisions, together, for the sake of the gospel, and through the gift of Christ's congregation, Bethel.


