# Pastor's Article: Belief Statement God calls us to a lifelong journey of Christian discipleship and we invite all to join us

# BETHEL LUTHERAN CHURCH GUIDING PRINCIPLE: LIFE-LONG FAITH FORMATION

"But grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ."

(2 Peter 3:18a) Deepening our faith strengthens our discipleship. Ours is a congregation that believes God calls us to be life-long learners. So we plan for opportunities to strengthen our relationship with God and invite all to participate.

It is in Bethel's DNA to be a congregation which practices life-long faith formation. In the Fall of 1946, a collaborative effort was launched by the ladies of the First English Lutheran Church and a parish worker for the Augustana Lutheran Church to survey the Lower Sun River Area of Great Falls. The survey led to the discovery that a lot of young families were making the Lower Sun River area their home. That led to the organization of a Sunday School which was led by pastor, seminary intern and lay leaders from First English Lutheran who met at the Russell school. Seventy-one years ago a Vacation Bible School began and eventually the Lower Sun River Lutheran Church (which was renamed Bethel in March of 1951) was started and the rest is history. Faith formation or Christian education is indispensable in the life and ministry of the church. Bethel's beginnings bear witness to the vital of role of faith formation in the love of Christ, for the sake of the community and the world.



In the last four weeks, I have officiated at the baptisms of two children and one teen and there are three more baptisms scheduled to take place before I retire. What a joy to celebrate the gift of new life in Christ and the beginning of what will be a life-long faith journey. When we are united to Christ's death and resurrection in the waters of baptism, we are initiated into Body of Christ, also known as the church. The Church is God's gift for our spiritual nourishment and growth, and for service in the ministry of Jesus Christ. The Church is God's instrument of grace where faith is deepened and nurtured and where discipleship is strengthened. From the Evangelical Lutheran Worship, *Service of Holy Baptism*, we read these words, "Living with Christ and in the communion of saints, we grow in faith, love, and obedience to the will of God."

The first reading chosen for this Sunday is from the book of Deuteronomy. In this reading we learn that the Lord God of Israel is the one and only God to be at the center of the people of Israel's lives. God calls for their and our undivided loyalty to Godself. "Hear, O Israel: The Lord is our God, the Lord alone. You shall love the Lord your God with all your heart, and with all your soul, and with all your might." From these verses is the prayer of the Hebrew people called the Shema. The word Shema is the Hebrew word which translates, "hear." From one generation to the next, they were to pray this creed at least twice a day and to love the Lord in word and deed. "Recite them to your children and talk about them when you are at home and when you are away, when you lie down and when you rise up." God's plan was that faith was to be formed in the hearts and lives of all of God's children. The great reformer,

Dr. Martin Luther, was asked to write a catechism for parents to be able to teach their children the basics of the Christian faith. Many of us have had the

experience of having to memorize and to recite before God, family and church, Luther's Small Catechism. It was a requirement of those who were to be confirmed in the Lutheran expression of the Christian faith. Faith formation takes place in many different ways. My parents and the church (Sunday School teachers, pastors, seminary professors) were the most prominent teachers and influencers in my faith journey. Who were yours? Who are yours, today?

Faith formation continues for youth at Bethel through the ministry of Logos. It continues for adults in small groups which meet weekly in


a variety of locations and from the comfort of our homes and on-line because of the pandemic. Faith formation takes place through the ministry of Northern Rockies Institute of Theology, and the Lay Pastoral Associate Programs of the Montana Synod. Faith formation happens in worship and

following worship when adult forums are offered. It takes place in Vacation Bible Schools which are offered every Summer, except for this one, unfortunately.

I encourage us all to stay curious. To read scripture, to study, to pray and to wrestle with the questions of faith lived out all life long and in the context of community. All of us are invited take part in opportunities offered to us so that we will continue to "...grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ." 2 Peter 3:18a For the sake of loving and blessing the world.

# When a Pastor Retires

The relationship between pastor and congregation is a special one. A pastor is called to preach, teach and administer the sacraments, but often the connections made go beyond the professional role and become deeply personal. To be sure, it is a gift for a pastor to be involved in the lives of the people they serve. Over time these relationships develop and parishioners become friends. The line between pastor and friend becomes blurred. It becomes difficult, when the time comes and the call has ended, to assume a different role in the lives of these friends.

When a pastor leaves a congregation, members may feel they have lost a trusted friend. Like the eternal presence of God, the presence of God's ministers takes on an aura of permanence, and members are surprised and hurt. It is extremely difficult to shift roles. The pastor ceases to be the pastor and a friend, and becomes friend only; members cease being one's flock and friends, and become friends only. Relationships must be redefined apart from the ecclesiastical roles. The pain of such change only compounds the sense of mutual loss and grief.

Another aspect of this change in relationship and the expectations which



accompany it is whether Pastor Steve and Kaye will retain their membership and continue to gather with the congregation for worship and involvement in Bethel's ministries. The ELCA's guidelines for retired pastors of Word and Sacrament states that "a retired pastor should not remain a member of the congregation served at the time of retirement. This is to prevent divided loyalties in the congregation and pressures on either the former, interim or future pastors. Transferring one's membership to another congregation allows the successor pastor to assume pastoral leadership more readily. It also provides an opportunity for the retired pastor to enter fully into the life of a different congregation with clarity about the pastor's retired role. A retired minister of Word and Sacrament is no longer pastor of a congregation and therefore must discontinue the functions of the pastoral office in any congregation previously served unless specifically authorized to do so. Ministers of Word and Sacrament must respect the integrity of the ministry of congregations which they do not serve as well as the authority of the current pastors of such congregations."

I do intend to abide by these guidelines, and pray that God's grace be sufficient for us all in this time of change and transition. During the remaining weeks as your pastor, I hope that we will be able to find ways to celebrate ministry, share our goodbyes and give thanks to God for the many blessings shared in our life together.

The following paragraphs are from a document of the ELCA on Pastoral Ethics When Leaving a Call and Guidelines for Congregational Membership The following draws heavily upon an Alban Institute publication by Edward A. White—Saying Goodbye: A Time of Growth for Congregations and Pastors—a helpful resource for those wishing to review this topic further.

# Bethel Lutheran Church Church Council Reopening Guidelines

We will still be offering a live stream of the service for those who wish to worship from home.

#### **Guidelines:**

- Front doors will be propped open and the only entrance into the Church. The west side entrance through the TLC Daycare will remain locked.
- Masks will be <u>required</u> and we have some available.
- A table is at the front doors with hand sanitizer, masks, tissues and an offering plate. Ushers will be there to assist with masks and help people find seats.
- Physical distancing of 4 feet will be observed.
- Windows and doors will be opened to increase air circulation.
- Signs on the restroom doors should be used to indicate if you are in the bathroom in an effort to keep the 6 feet physical distance.
- The kitchen, Fellowship Hall and back office hall doors will be closed.
- Hospitality area will be closed.
- We will pass the peace in a no-contact fashion.
- Sanctuary will be cleaned with disinfect cleaner after each Sunday worship service

Please consider the following <u>before you return to worship:</u>

- Have you traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone who has traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone with flu-like symptoms in the past 30 days?
- Have you had any of these symptoms:
  - Fever over 100.4
  - Persistent cough
  - Shortness of breath
  - Sudden loss of taste or smell

If you answered YES to any of these questions, please do not enter and contact your health care provider.

Allie graduated May 29, 2020 from CMR High School. She plans to attend Utah University to study elementary education and will also play volleyball for the Utes!




# JOIN US FOR NIGHT WITHOUT A BED for Family Promise Great Falls
