- •Bethel Bunch at the Highwood Bar. Please contact Terry Korpela for more info and reservations. Reservations need to be placed by Wednesday, July 12.


## Holiday office closure


## Synod News Lay Pastoral Assistant Classes this Fall

Out of the great need for a second LPA class comes the LPA East class. Beginning October 2017, this new class will open up opportunities for those living in eastern Montana. This class will meet in Glendive, MT at Zion Lutheran and be administered by the Montana Synod and hosted by Pastor Katie Emery. We are now looking for individuals interested in attending to speak with your pastor about the program. The first step in applying is to have your pastor write a recommendation.

What is an LPA? A Lay Pastoral Associate in the Montana Synod is a congregational lay person who has received religious, educational training, through the Montana Synod, in order to provide (in most cases) short term pulpit supply (ie, preaching) when the pastor is away, or if a congregation is without a pastor. Their role is to fill in for the basic pastoral duties such as providing Word and Sacrament, communion, and other roles as approved by the Bishop. LPAs are NOT authorized to preside at weddings. The program includes foundation courses in Old and New Testament, Church History and Lutheran Theology, retreats in the areas of Spirituality and Prayer, Worship leadership, Preaching and Pastoral Care, and Mentor guided activities.
