

### Chosen. Gifted to Love and Serve

#### "Choose this day whom you will serve..." -Joshua 24:15

"..just as the Son of Man came not to be served but to serve, and give his life, a ransom for many." ~~~ Matthew 20: 28

This Sunday afternoon at 4:00 pm there will be another in person gathering for worship and it will include the Affirmation of Baptism for seven eighth graders and their families. We are choosing to limit this in person worship service to just the confirmands, their families, and some Logos and worship leaders, mindful of the current guidelines for re-opening during Phase 2. Darn this pandemic! It has altered a whole lot of life and I don't like it. But the good news is that we will be doing this worship by Zoom so that we can accommodate sponsors and other loved ones and one of the confirmands who is out of town. Also, so that I can preside at this service before I retire.



I have reminded these young people that the Affirmation of Baptism (Rite of Confirmation) is one of the "stepping stone moments" in the journey of faith at which they will make public profession of faith and assume greater responsibilities in the life of our congregation, and in service to the world. During the service they will be asked, "Do you intend to continue in the covenant God made with you in Holy Baptism:

- \* to live among God's faithful people,
- \* to hear God's Word and to share in holy communion,
- \* to proclaim the good news of God in Christ through word and deed,
- \* to serve all people, following the example of our Lord Jesus,
- \* and to strive for justice and peace in all the earth?

If so, then answer, "I do, and I ask God to help and guide me." This is their moment to affirm the promises of baptism and to continue the journey of faith in God… who first chose them. As Lutherans, we profess an understanding of the Christian faith that asserts that God chose us long before we could even begin choosing God. I have chosen as the First Reading for Sunday, a reading from Joshua, the 24th chapter. It includes the familiar passage spoken by Joshua, "As for me and my household, we will serve the Lord." As like Joshua's profession of faith in God, so it is for the parents, sponsors, and the community of faith, when they trusted God's means of grace in the gift of Holy Baptism. And when they brought them to worship, Sunday School, Logos, VBS, Flathead Lutheran Bible Camp, and nurtured their lives of faith in the home.

All of us rooted, nurtured and sustained by God's promises, "I will be with you. I will never forsake you," (Joshua 1: 5b) make choices each day to follow Christ. Christ, who shows us the sacrificial, others centered example of how to serve. The way of compassion, mercy and forgiveness. Oh, how the

world aches and groans to experience this kind of servanthood and leadership, which we have been called to offer.

On Sunday we will have the joy of singing a couple of verses and the chorus of the hymn composed by David Haas, "You Are Mine." Hear the promises of God spoken to you.....

"I will come to you in the silence, I will lift you from all your fear. You will hear my voice, I claim you as my choice. Be still and know I am here. Do not be afraid, I am with you. I have called you each by name. Come and follow me, I will bring you home; I love you and you are mine."

Please keep the following confirmands, their parents and families in your prayers: Mac Carlson, Julia Elkin, Ava Fossen, Maelee Frick, Kyle Gilbertson, Travis Palmer and James Pinski. I share a prayer that has become much more meaningful during the time in which we live.

Lord God, you have called your servants to ventures of which we cannot see the ending, by paths as yet untrodden, through perils unknown. Give us faith to go out with courage, not knowing where we go, but only that your hand is leading us and your love supporting us, through Jesus Christ our Lord. Amen.

# Bethel Lutheran Church Church Council Reopening Guidelines

# We will still be offering a live stream of the service for those who wish to worship from home.

#### **Guidelines:**

- Front doors will be propped open and only entrance into the Church
- Masks will be <u>required</u> and we have some available to parishioners.
- A table is at the front doors with hand sanitizer, masks and tissues for your use. Ushers will be there to assist with masks and help people find seats.
- Physical distancing of 6 feet will be observed.
- Holy communion will be offered at a later date. We will be announcing prior to Sunday worship when we resume.
- Windows and doors will be opened to increase air circulation.
- Signs on the restroom doors should be used to indicate if you are in the bathroom in an effort to keep the 6 feet physical distance.
- The Gathering Place doors will be closed and sign posted as well as west side doors will remain locked to prevent cross contamination to the TLC Daycare.
- The kitchen, Fellowship Hall and back office hall doors will be closed.
- Hospitality area will be closed.
- An offering tray is set up as you enter Bethel and will not be passed during the offering plates.
- We will pass the peace in a no-contact fashion.
- Sanctuary will be cleaned with disinfect cleaner after each Sunday worship service.

Please consider the following before you return to worship:

- Have you traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone who has traveled outside the U.S. in the past 30 days?
- Have you been in close contact with anyone with flu-like symptoms in the past 30 days?
- Have you had any of these symptoms:
  - Fever over 100.4
  - Persistent cough
  - Shortness of breath
  - Sudden loss of taste or smell

If you answered YES to any of these questions, please do not enter and contact your health care provider.



# FLBC SUMMER CAMP UPDATE


Dear friends in Christ,



Bethel's Vacation Bible School is cancelled for this summer and we look forward to Summer 2021.


