Open my heart to the peace and joy generosity brings into my life

A few weeks ago I walked into the church and saw the gum ball display. As I stood and looked at it I thought, "Wow, what a great way to exemplify the importance of mutually committing to paying off our debt early". Working together we can do great things!

As I drove to the office I began to think of easy ways for anyone to make this commitment. My first thought was of Starbucks coffee. I like to order a grande sugar free hazelnut iced latte. I hand the barista a five dollar bill and say keep the change as a tip. Now let's do the math, \$5 a day for 7 days is \$35 a week and \$1820 a year. If I decided to give up Starbucks for five years I would save \$9100. That gives me \$8000 for a gum ball and \$1100 for my IRA. I also think I would lose five to ten pounds!!!

Another idea came to me at happy hour last Friday when I was in Bismarck seeing my son Andrew. We had a few beverages, an appetizer, dinner, and cheesecake for dessert. Looking at the bill I wondered how we ate and drank so much. Driving back to Andrew's house my mind wandered and I thought of the \$140 I paid for dinner. It seems like I eat out once on the weekend with friends. What if I skipped a week? That would be \$140 for 12 months equaling \$1680 for one year and \$8400 for five years. Guess what, if I use this strategy I can buy a gum ball!!!

The more I thought about buying a gum ball the more I thought about my lifestyle. I feel like a prodigal daughter of God's kingdom. Keeping in mind the word prodigal means "one who wastes money". There's a fear in making this type of commitment because I might have a greedy month where I eat out every weekend after having Starbucks all week. And then what will I do?

The key is I need to find peace in my life and trust God. I need to remind myself to give thanks, serve others, and practice generosity. And as I do this my fear will turn into faith. It's my faith that will open my heart to the peace and joy generosity brings into my life.
