World Hunger Offering


For today's World Hunger offering, you may wish to direct your gift for on-the-ground relief in South Sudan for the millions of people who face famine or who have been forced to flee.

Communion Distribution Change

We will begin using a new communion distribution practice this Sunday, May 7th. We will be moving from intinction to individual cups and pouring chalices. Why, you might ask? Two years ago we had a study of communion practices across the ELCA, including our Synod. Some of you participated in small groups at Bethel and gave input about our holy communion hospitality (who is welcome at the table) and methods of distribution. As a result of this input, we will be initiating this new practice. New pouring chalices and flagons were designed, crafted and gifted to Bethel by Judy (Erickson) Larson.
