The Heart of the Matter: The main person
doing something in worship is God. God greets us
with the forgiveness of sins. God meets us with an
open ear when we pray. God speaks to us in the
Word, offerings words of promise and challenge.
God joins us in the water of baptism and the bread
and wine of communion. God sends us out with a
blessing. Why wouldn't everyone want to start out
each their lives in God's actions?

OCT. 22, 2017 - "Telling the Truth Twice" * Law & Gospel

The Heart of the Matter: God uses God's Word in two ways. First, God uses the Word as Law, to tell us how to love the neighbor — to tell us those things we are to do for the neighbor and to tell us those things we are not to do to the neighbor. When God uses the Word as law, God creates a more loving world but also reminds us of our sin. Second, God

uses the Word as gospel — to tell us all of the good things that God will do for us, since we are not able to do them for ourselves — forgive our sins, give us new life, grant us reconciliation and eternal life.

OCT. 29, 2017 - "You Didn't Choose Me, I Chose you!"" * Election

The Heart of the Matter: God doesn't wait for us to make an application for acceptance into the kingdom of heaven, God chooses us. Think of any major character in the Bible: Abraham and Sarah, Jacob and Rachel, David and Bathsheba, Peter, Paul and Mary. Did any choose God? No, God choose them. And God chooses you.



Pastor Steve's Message

"Finding God the Last Place You Would Look"

"For I decided to know nothing among you except Jesus Christ, and him crucified." 1 Corinthians 2: 2



If the Apostle were to be asked to summarize the Gospel of Jesus Christ in just a few words it would be (The Message) "I deliberately kept it plain and simple: first Jesus and who he is; then Jesus and what he did – Jesus crucified." God reveals Godself as concealed in the cross and his life in the death of his Son. He breathed it; and preached it through word and deed. He was a theologian of the cross.

A theologian is one who is a student of the ways of God and God's relationship with humankind and all of creation. A theologian of the cross (Latin: theologia cruces), is one who affirms that God's revelation comes under the appearance of the opposite. For example, God is mighty in human weakness. God imparts life even amidst its destruction. God's love for us is made known in Christ's suffering and death on the cross. The theologian of the cross stands in contrast to the theologian of illusoria (Latin: theologia illusoria). The word illusoria is the word from which we get the word illuson. It means make-believe, to play at.

The theologian of illusoria is one who would refuse to connect suffering or the cross to God and God's will. They would equate suffering and lack of wholeness, wealth and happiness in one's life to one's lack of faith. (Personal story) As my mom suffered from cancer and it became clear that the treatments weren't going to prolong or bring healing to her life, one of her well meaning Christian friends (a theologian of illusoria) called her up and told her that the reason that she wasn't healed of her cancer was because my mother just didn't have enough faith to believe that God wanted her to be healed. In my mom's despairing, I spoke the words which were spoken to each of us in our baptism into Christ's death and resurrection: "You are mine. God is with you; God is faithful to you, now and always."

As in Martin Luther's day, we live in a day where pain and suffering is to be avoided at all costs and pleasure is the virtue to be sought after most. Suffering and pain pushes us to the edge and raises the "Why?" and the "How can this be remedied?" questions. The horrific and unspeakable violence and death and the wave of suffering in Las Vegas earlier this week, raise these questions. Suffering and pain bring us to those times when we cry out in our despairing moments, as did Jesus, "My God, my God, why have you forsaken me?" Times when we feel far away from God. But pain and suffering can also bring us closer to God. One theologian puts it this way, "Martin Luther (pastorally speaking) knew that we humans run from their crosses. In fact, however, suffering and pain are the way by which God breaks down self centeredness so that humans can actually rely on God for their lives and well being." Dictionary of Luther and the Lutheran Traditions, General Editor, Dr. Timothy Wengert, Baker Academic For us who have spent nights..weeks or even years of physical suffering and pain, we know all too well what those experiences can do to our faith and our own lack of ability to change those circumstances.

Being a *theologian of the cross* is a life-long journey. It is the call of discipleship and it is shaped by our own life experiences. God is revealed to us in the hidden and unexpected places of life. Be on the lookout!






Synod House Build Update
