

"Church Is Messy and Holy"

Be clear about this — God does not cause the suffering. Suffering is the result of sin, human

OCT. 15, 2017 - "Guess Who's Coming to Worship?!" * The Means of Grace and Christian Worship

The Heart of the Matter: The main person doing something in worship is God. God greets us with the forgiveness of sins. God meets us with an open ear when we pray. God speaks to us in the Word, offerings words of promise and challenge. God joins us in the water of baptism and the bread and wine of communion. God sends us out with a blessing. Why wouldn't everyone want to start out each their lives in God's actions?

OCT. 22, 2017 - "Telling the Truth Twice"

* Law & Gospel

The Heart of the Matter: God uses God's Word in two ways. First, God uses the Word as Law, to tell us how to love the neighbor — to tell us those things we are to do for the neighbor and to tell us those things we are not to do to the neighbor. When God uses the Word as law, God creates a more loving world but also reminds us of our sin. Second, God uses the Word as gospel — to tell us all of the good things that God will do for us, since we are not able to do them for ourselves — forgive our sins, give us new life, grant us reconciliation and eternal life.

OCT. 29, 2017 - "You Didn't Choose Me, I Chose you!"" * Election

The Heart of the Matter: God doesn't wait for us to make an application for acceptance into the kingdom of heaven, God chooses us. Think of any major character in the Bible: Abraham and Sarah, Jacob and Rachel, David and Bathsheba, Peter, Paul and Mary. Did any choose God? No, God choose them. And God chooses you.

Pastor Steve's Message

"The Church and the Christian Life: The Church is Messy and Holy"

My Uncle Al and I had differing viewpoints about faith and the life of the Christian in the world. For him it boiled down to ethics. Follow the "Golden Rule." Live respectful of others, be honest, be and do good. At the end of the day, that's it. There was no need for him to be a part of organized religion (a local church). Often he would site the reason that he didn't want to be a Christian and live the Christian life because he witnessed professing Christians living in ways that were contrary to their faith. "Christians are all hypocrites!" he said.

A couple of Sundays ago, I climbed up a ladder in church as a sermon illustration. My aim, to illustrate a viewpoint of the Christian life as striving to reach God by climbing the "ladder of good works to heaven." An ancient approach, developed by Aristotle and taught by Thomas Aquinas, was the understanding of God being the "good" towards which people would work or strive. As a person increased their participation in greater works of doing "good," they would move up closer to God and in degrees of holiness. This viewpoint was problematic for the Reformers. They believed that viewpoint (striving) would lead people to believe that they have no need for Christ. One can be "self-righteous." The Reformers taught the good news that the "righteous shall live by faith in Christ, not by climbing the ladder of good works and ascending in degrees of holiness. Salvation is received not achieved! Good works had their place – serving the neighbor in love.

The heart of the matter for this coming Sunday's theme is that the "Church is Messy and Holy." How so? Because the church (Body of Christ) is the people of God who are simultaneously saint and sinner. Dr. Martin Luther described this state of being as "simultaneously justified and sinful at the same time." In Latin it is expressed *simul* (simultaneously) justus (just or justified) et (and) peccator (sinful). It is a paradox of the faith. The Christian has a dual identity as theyare 100% sinful and 100% justified and forgiven through the gift of Christ's righteousness. The Church is therefore both messy and holy at the same time. We have our life experiences which bare witness to this truth.

The church is God's people, simultaneously saint and sinner. It has room for the sceptics like my Uncle Al as well as the seeking souls. It is God's gift used to bless the world.
