THE MUSLIM THREAT? - OR THE THREAT TO MUSLIMS?

We have seen an explosion in recent years of information about Islam and about Muslim people. TV specials, magazine articles, books, specially-produced DVDs - each presenting its own viewpoint on the world's second-largest religion. Some are produced by Muslims and portray a tolerant, peace-loving religion practiced by a culturally diverse population. Others challenge this with a picture of a backward religion and culture which is completely incompatible with modern Western civilization and which fosters violence and extremism. Which are we to believe? How can we evaluate such conflicting claims? And is there an unseen force behind this flood of publicity?

Pastor Steven Benson will shed some light on these and other issues. He will draw on his experiences and conversations over many years with Muslims and Christians in America, the Middle East, and South Asia. He will also bring to bear insights from the past 1400 years of Christian-Muslim encounters and studies of modern propaganda campaigns.

Pastor's Message



Hurricane Harvey Disaster Response

The driving distance between Great Falls to Houston is approximately 1,500 miles, give or take a few, but we are only a prayer away. Here in Great Falls it is another hot and smokey Summer day. Many wildfires are still burning up forests and threatening homes and properties across our state. In Houston the deluge of wind and rain from Hurricane Harvey is just beginning to subside. But the flood waters, their damage and the loss of loved ones, homes and a way of life are overwhelming and staggering.

The news and pictures depicting the human (and pets, livestock, all God's critters) suffering in Houston and surrounding region have evoked heart-felt empathy from us. Calls have come to the church asking for guidance on our response towards the overwhelming need. The ELCA, is active and present in the areas affected through the collaborative efforts of "Lutheran Disaster Response." LDR is working together with those attending to the needs and will be involved for the long haul. They send this message to us:

"Lutheran Disaster Response's affiliate is actively present, collaborating with community leaders and officials to initiate the proper responses, particularly the long-term recovery efforts. Together we have a strong history of working with disasters in the Gulf Coast area. Recovery effort are expected to take years, and Lutheran Disaster Response will be there to accompany those affected through every phase of this disaster."

How can you help?

- *First*, pray.
- Second, help share information (available at elca.org, Bethel Notes, this Sunday's Bulletin, etc.)
- *Third*, you can give through Bethel (please footnote: "US Hurricane Disaster Response"). You can also give directly through the ELCA.ORG website as well.
- Fourth, do not organize in-gatherings of anything. Right now money is needed. Donations of items are more of a burden than a help.
- Fifth, do not self-deploy. When volunteers are needed, you can sign up with a reputable group.

A long time ago, the prophet Isaiah spoke God's promise to a fearful, displaced and overwhelmed people, "Do not fear, for I have redeemed you; I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters, I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire you shall not be burned, and the flame shall not consume you." Isaiah 43: 1a-2

Thanks be to God that we have the promise of God's abiding presence amidst all of life and especially during the trials and storms, and that we are a part of a church which responds, generously, with help and hope!



SERMON SERIES IN COMMEMORATION OF THE 500th ANNIVERSARY OF THE REFORMATION TO BEGIN SEPTEMBER 10th

To mark the 500th anniversary of the Reformation, many Christians from the Reformation tradition will want to hear and learn about essential Reformation teachings. I'm trusting that Bethel is among the many...for I will be using a preaching series developed by Dr. Rolf Jacobson, Professor at Luther Seminary in St. Paul, MN. Beginning on Sunday, September 10th and continuing for 8 weeks, the sermon focus will be on several essential Reformation teachings.

SEPT 10, 2017 - "Jesus is God's Best Idea Ever"

* Salvation by Grace through Faith in Jesus Christ

The Heart of the Matter: Justification is about how we have a right relationship with God. The Reformation insists that God does everything and we do nothing: "If justification comes through the law, Christ died for nothing."

SEPT 17, 2017 - "The Bible Is God's Word for You, but It Isn't Your God" * * * The Word of God

The Heart of the Matter: God's Word is the means of grace through which God transforms our lives. Jesus himself is the living Word made flesh. The Bible is the living water through which God nourishes us, so that like trees that can withstand crisis and yet bear fruit, we live lives of faithfulness and love.

SEPT 24, 2017 WEEK 3 "Forgiveness Will Change Your Life" *The Forgiveness of Sins

The Heart of the Matter: The Bible proclaims this good news: "in Christ God was reconciling the world to himself, not counting their trespasses against them, and entrusting the message of reconciliation to us" (2 Corinthians 5:19). We are all born into sin, into brokenness, into death. We all sin. In Christ, there is forgiveness for all. And the forgiven in turn forgive and forgive and forgive.

OCT. 1, 2017 - "Church Is Messy and Holy" *The Church and the Christian Life

The Heart of the Matter: The church — which is the people of God, not a building or an organization — is both fully human and fully divine. And every Christian is both fully made holy and also still fully a sinner. After being given a right relationship with God through grace, we paradoxically remain sinners (people who need a right relationship with God) and are already saints (people who already have right relationship with God.

OCT. 8, 2017 - "Finding God the Last Place You Would Look" *The Theology of the Cross

The Heart of the Matter: The cross is God's promise — God's solemn commitment —to be present in the last place human reason would look for God...in the midst of suffering, oppression, violence, even death. Be clear about this — God does not cause the suffering. Suffering is the result of sin, human

OCT. 15, 2017 - "Guess Who's Coming to Worship?!"

*The Means of Grace and Christian Worship

The Heart of the Matter: The main person doing something in worship is God. God greets us with the forgiveness of sins. God meets us with an open ear when we pray. God speaks to us in the Word, offerings words of promise and challenge. God joins us in the water of baptism and the bread and wine of communion. God sends us out with a blessing. Why wouldn't everyone want to start out each their lives in God's actions?

OCT. 22, 2017 - "Telling the Truth Twice" * Law & Gospel

The Heart of the Matter: God uses God's Word in two ways. First, God uses the Word as Law, to tell us how to love the neighbor — to tell us those things we are to do for the neighbor and to tell us those things we are not to do to the neighbor. When God uses the Word as law, God creates a more loving world but also reminds us of our sin. Second, God uses the Word as gospel — to tell us all of the good things that God will do for us, since we are not able to do them for ourselves — forgive our sins, give us new life, grant us reconciliation and eternal life.

OCT. 29, 2017 - "You Didn't Choose Me, I Chose you!"" * Election

The Heart of the Matter: God doesn't wait for us to make an application for acceptance into the kingdom of heaven, God chooses us. Think of any major character in the Bible: Abraham and Sarah, Jacob and Rachel, David and Bathsheba, Peter, Paul and Mary. Did any choose God? No, God choose them. And God chooses you.

Reformation Commemoration on Monday, October 30th, 7:00pm at the Helena Cathedral

On Monday, October 30, 2017, at 7 PM, Lutherans and Catholics will gather for evening prayer at the Helena Cathedral, in a special service to commemorate the 500th Anniversary of the Reformation.

Based on the prayer service "From Conflict to Communion" held in Lund, Sweden a year ago, with Pope Francis and members of the Lutheran World Federation, the service will include leadership by Bishop Michael Warfel, Diocese of Great Falls/Billings; Bishop George Thomas, Diocese of Helena; Bishop Jessica Crist, Montana Synod ELCA, and former Bishop Mark Ramseth.



From the Treasurer

Last year the stewardship team said "There shall be showers of blessings" and our Bethel family has continued to do just that! Below is a quick update on the overall church budget.



	Budget	Actual	Difference
Total Income	\$132,366	\$133,245	\$879
Total Expense	\$131,714	\$136,655	\$4,941
Net	\$652	(\$3,410)	(\$4,062)

Thanks to faithful and generous giving, income was \$879 ahead of budget.

However, expenses have exceeded budget by \$4,941 through six months ending July 31, 2017. This is due largely to:

- Unexpected copier expense of \$3,353.75 due to significant overages in color copy use. This issue has been addressed by church staff and council with new procedures put in place to avoid future overages.
- Office supplies exceeding budget year-to-date by \$1,385.02 due in part to the purchase of new letterhead and a new sign. These expenses are infrequent, generally occurring once very year or two.
- > Grounds maintenance and repairs exceeding budget by \$2,196.86 due to higher than anticipated repairs and maintenance expenses through the first six months of operations.

These overages were partially off-set by being under-budget in other areas.
