First Sunday in Lent



This catechetical focus on the meaning of faith is at the heart of our Lenten journey to the baptismal waters of Easter. Greetings Bethel!

This week we begin the season of Lent, and next week we will begin our Lenten Soup Suppers and Thursday evening worship services. The suppers this year will begin at 6:00pm, and our worship will begin at 6:45pm. As we eat and worship together, we will focus on the topic of righteousness. What is righteousness? Who is involved in righteousness? And what do we hear about righteousness in the world and in the Bible? Each week we will have questions that will be posted in the Bethel Notes the week before, and then discussed around the table during our dinner together. Then, during the traditional reflection time of our worship we will talk together about our conversations and thoughts around

that week's questions. I hope that this conversation will carry out into your weekly lives, and enliven some of your thoughts as we walk this path towards the Cross together.

For the first week our conversation prompt is this:

Part 1

What is righteousness? Where have you heard this term used, and in what ways? What kind of emotions does the term righteousness evoke in you or in people you know and why do you think that is?

Part 2

Righteousness is defined by many theologians as "living in right relationship with God". How is this different or similar to some of the definitions you may have heard while discussing part 1? What are ways that you or people you know have lived righteously? What are some ways that maybe you or folks you know have struggled with this?

I look forward to walking through this season of Lent with you all, and continuing to dive into this larger conversation of righteousness together!

Grief Workshop Begins February 19th

Grief is the anguish experienced after significant loss, usually the death of a beloved person. Grief often includes physiological distress, separation anxiety, confusion, yearning, obsessive dwelling on the past, and apprehension about the future. Join our guest speaker Rev. Sara MacGilvra Branom, Chaplin at Peace Hospice in Great Falls, as she leads us in discussion about how we, as people of faith, talk about and manage grief.

This will be a three-part education series, you may come to one or all three. February 19th, 26th and March 5th in the Fellowship Hall following worship.

Reverend Sara MacGilvra Branom is an ordained minister of the United Church of Christ. (UCC) Her call is to chaplaincy, she



currently serves as the chaplain for Benefis Peace Hospice. She earned her B.A. in Psychology from San Jose State University, a Master's in Human Services from the University of Great Falls, and her M.Div. from Chicago Theological Seminary with a concentration in chaplaincy. Chaplain Sara's basis for her ministry is a response to Jesus' words when the disciples failed to be with him in his greatest time of need the night before his crucifixion. "So could you not watch with me for one hour?" Matt 26:40. Chaplaincy is being with someone in their time of need. To sit with them, share that space invoking the presence of God for comfort, and understanding and perhaps find meaning in their lament, and despair by providing spiritual and/or emotional support to all who request it, regardless of their faith, beliefs, or traditions. loving them on their terms as the holy Creation they are.

GOSPEL MESSAGE

February 26, 2023 FIRST SUNDAY IN LENT

If You . . .

In today's gospel, Jesus is led by the Spirit into the wilderness to be tempted. This story recalls that of Job, whose righteousness God also allowed to be tested. Both Job and Jesus are urged to turn away from what they know to be true and faithful. In Job's case, it is his friends who are relentless in making this enticement.

Another commonality in these stories is the phrase "If you." Three times in today's gospel the tempter says to Jesus, "If you . . ." In Job's story, this phrase is hurled back and forth between him and his friends. These two little words are meant to test and are always conditional: If you do or do not meet the condition, some consequence or other will follow.

In a world full of conditions, it can be hard to believe that God's saving work is completely unconditional. Even we who proclaim God's free gift of grace might fall into saying it is free *if you* accept it. We cling to the work we might do to make ourselves right with God.

In his Small Catechism explanation of the sixth petition of the Lord's Prayer, Martin Luther suggests that God does not tempt anyone, but that the devil, the world, and we ourselves provide plenty in the way of opportunities to be led astray. God does not need to provide conditions and tests—we excel at this all on our own. When we pray, "Lead us not into temptation," Luther says we are praying for God's protection. This is never conditional. We pray for God's protection so we might learn to see it in the world and in ourselves.

When you pray the Lord's Prayer today, regardless of the temptations you face, know that you are a beloved child of God, fearfully and wonderfully made to be an instrument of God's unconditional grace in and for the world.


