Getting Political with Luther: Cultivating Virtues to Serve God and Neighbor

Dr Anthony Bateza will lead this "Luther Lecture" on Tuesday, February 22 - 9:30 to 2:30 (Mountain Time)

Dr. Bateza is Associate Professor of Religion at St. Olaf College in Minnesota. Dr. Bateza is a specialist in Martin Luther, moral theology and Christian ethics. His primary area of research examines Luther's political theology, focusing on the reformer's understanding of human agency and his relationship with the virtue tradition. Dr. Bateza's other scholarly interests include the broader Augustinian tradition, the impact of Luther's thought on 19th century philosophy, and questions of race, identity, and social justice.

Dr. Bateza has earned degrees from Iowa State University (B.S, 2002), Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago (M.Div., 2006), and Princeton Theological Seminary (Ph.D., 2017). An ordained pastor in the ELCA, Dr. Bateza enjoys speaking in various congregational settings learning alongside God's people.

One person would use a toe or sandal to trace an arch in the dust like this:


The other person would respond by tracing a second arch like this:
