

Great Falls Rising presents: "HATE AND EXTREMISM IN MONTANA: What we as a community need to know to stand against HATE." Tuesday, January 16th, Church of the Incarnation, 600 3rd Ave. North.

5:30 to 6:00 pm: Visit information tables on groups fighting Hate and Extremism.

6:00 pm: Panel of Experts: Ken Toole (Montana Human Rights Network founder), Travis McAdams, (Southern Poverty Law Center), Maggie Bornstein (former ACLU employee).

Panelists will present a brief history of Hate and Extremism in Montana and Current Hate and Extremism activities in the state and nation, as well as Montana State Legislature connections and recent bills that have promoted Hate and Extremism. Audience members will be encouraged to ask questions. The hard-right movement mobilized Hate and Extremism from the mainstream to Main Street in recent years.

On January 6, 2021, the nation watched as our Capitol was attacked by extremist groups. Since that time, we have seen the antisemites, conspiracy theorists and white nationalists welcomed by government officials.

Great Falls and the State of Montana have seen the spread of hate literature in our communities. We are seeing hate and extremist groups everywhere: people's homes, schools, doctors' offices, libraries, bars, restaurants, churches and other community spaces. The fear of the "Great Replacement" is spreading throughout

our city. Great Falls Rising feels strongly that our community needs to be informed about what is happening and who these groups are. Unfortunately, some of our elected officials have connections to these groups. Join us for a critical discussion on hate and extremism in Montana.




Faith, Seen and Unseen

"Follow me," says Jesus to Philip. Then "Come and see," says Philip to Nathanael. Early in the Gospel of John and in Jesus' public ministry, the movement is already spreading. This transmission of faith from person to person is something like a fire jumping from one twig to another.



To change metaphors, sometimes faith flows like an underground stream. In some limestone terrains, a stream of water might disappear from the surface and reappear farther along in a different kind of terrain. The fact that the stream can't be seen doesn't mean it has stopped flowing. Likewise, faith is sometimes difficult to identify, but that doesn't mean it's not flowing in and through someone's life. Visible signs of Jesus at work in a person are not always where or in the form we expect to see them. They can be in Sunday worship or in daily acts of kindness, compassion, grace, and love for ourselves and for others. Only Jesus knows what is in our hearts—already burning, deeply flowing, or yet to spark.
