


Church Council Meeting Highlights

Bethel Lutheran Church Council Meeting Highlights January 11, 2022

Bethel Lutheran Church Council met on Tuesday, January 11, 2022, by zoom. Here are some highlights from that meeting:

- Marilyn led from our devotional book, <u>Live in Grace Walk in Love</u> by Bob Goff.
 James 1:22 was the Bible verse and the devotion was titled, "No one is remembered for what they just planned to do.
- Tami reported Logos has been postponed this week because of school closure due to Covid.
- The 2022 Budget was approved. The Budget Forum is January 23, 2022.
- The transition protocols (<u>addendum</u>) were revisited. If there is adequate staff and volunteers, Sunday services will continue to meet in person and online. Members are encouraged to make informed, personal decisions.
- Pastor Jessie is planning to do some stewardship work in February.
- Council had a discussion on how to conduct the budget forum and the annual meeting. The health and well being of our members is our main priority. Therefore, after weighing the various options, we will hold the annual meeting and budget forum as hybrid in-person and zoom meetings. We will also provide a telephone option. We will provide detailed instructions in the Bethel Notes as well as the church announcements, and mail support to members that do not use the on-line option. All those attending in-person and electronically can vote and ask questions. No proxy voting will be allowed
- Any members interested in serving as representatives to the June 3-4, 2022 Synod Convention in Billings should let Council know prior to the annual meeting.
- February 6, 2022 was tentatively set as a possible date for a council retreat.
