The Holy Trinity


Though the word trinity is not found in the scriptures, to-day's second reading includes the apostolic greeting that begins the liturgy: The grace of our Lord Jesus Christ, the love of God, and the communion of the Holy Spirit be with you all. In the gospel Jesus sends his disciples forth to baptize in the name of the Father, and the Son, and the Holy Spirit. More than a doctrine, the Trinity expresses the heart of our faith: we have experienced the God of creation made known in Jesus Christ and with us always through the Holy Spirit. We celebrate the mystery of the Holy Trinity in word and sacrament, as we profess the creed, and as we are sent into the world to bear witness to our faith.

New Chairs for the Sanctuary?

The property committee has put many hours into finding the best prices and products for our future chairs in the sanctuary! According to our Constitution, whenever the Council wishes to spend money on things that are not in the budget, and cost above 2% of the annual expenses for the church, there must be a congregational vote. Therefore, the Council is calling a Congregational Meeting on June 11 at 10:45am (or directly following worship) to take a vote approving the purchase of 150 new chairs and the reupholstery of ten chairs. The ten chairs are ones that have arms, and are needed for several members in the congregation, but are not able to be ordered with the rest of the chairs. The total cost of this project is \$11,032.23 (including shipping). We will be having a "Sponsor a Chair" drive to pay for a portion of the chairs, and any remainder will be paid out of the Memorials Account. We need a quorum of at least 32 people there, so please join us in person or on Zoom so that we can make this important decision and move forward!

GOSPEL MESSAGE

June 1, 2023, The Holy Trinity

Authority and Assurance

When the eleven disciples arrived at the mountain to which Jesus had directed them, they might have been surprised or overwhelmed by his commission to make disciples, baptize, and teach.

At first glance, this description of their future ministry maybe felt like a tall order. But remember, they'd been watching and learning. And on either side of these ministry specifics are promises they surely found comforting: first authority, then assurance. "All authority in heaven and on earth has been given to me" (Matthew 28:18), Jesus said. This is authority in the best sense of the word, offered with confidence, love, and respect. The disciples are empowered to do the ministry Jesus is asking of them. And next, they are given assurance in these final words from Jesus, which serve as a benediction—"I am with you always, to the end of the age" (Matt. 28:20). Whatever the outcome—trials, or joys that come along the way as they disciple, baptize, and teach—Jesus will be present with them.

This call is not just for the eleven but for us as well. We are called to heal the brokenhearted, care for the earth, and work for peace in the world. This commission comes to us in baptism. And having been baptized in the name of the triune God whom we celebrate this festive day, the newly baptized—whether child or adult—is presented to the assembly and welcomed into the mission we share, invited to join in "giving thanks and praise to God and bearing God's creative and redeeming word to all the world" (*ELW*, p. 231).

Jesus sends the disciples from the mountain, and sends us empowered with the same authority and assurance that we do not go alone.






Candlelight Vigil


