Mission Endowment Committee Update & Plan

The Mission Endowment Committee met on Monday, 3/21/22. Members in attendance were: Johnna Lightbourne, Jim Carlson, Janet Smith, Greg Grosenick, Pastor Jessie Olbrecht, and **Jo Ann Dullum. Missing was Bob Norbie.**

Starting in mid-January, we attended the ELCA's REBOOT camp once a week for 4 weeks. We met live and online with over 100 people from different ELCA congregations across the country. During these 2 hour meetings, we heard stories from congregations on how they were able to reimagine church and their advice to other congregations who are trying to grow. Some common themes throughout these meetings were the importance of building relationships, both within the church but also extending into the community. They stressed the importance of having one-on-one conversations with people in the community and how to do that. We need to follow where the Holy Spirit leads which may be non-linear and messy. Ask ourselves, "Where do we need to grow?" and "What is the next faithful step we can take to grow in that direction?" One task was to look at the assets of our church but also the assets of our community. Some other statements from the class:

- 1) Vision....discern....take action....reflect
- 2) Mentor and multiply leaders
- 2) Take risks and experiment
- 4) Lead healthy change
- 5) Stay nimble and stay humble

When we started as the Mission Endowment committee, we talked about how we can reach out and be part of a larger effort to be God's hands in our community. Then Covid changed our lives. As we evaluated Bethel's assets, we determined Logos is our strongest and healthiest asset. Without the younger generation, the church will not survive into the future. We not only provide Christian education to our members but also to members of other church communities that do not have a youth program. Currently, we can see the fruits of having a strong Logos program over the years, 19 kids in confirmation and ~20 high school students. However, this year, there are only ~15 K-6 graders. The bones of Logos are still there but our committee has expressed concern over what this will look like in the near future.

Our group decided to start small and focus on success. We realize we need to reach out into the community and "market" Bethel and Logos. We are going to direct our efforts in the immediate neighborhood and also reach out to TLC staff and parents. At the same time we want to begin building up relationships among members of the church community and think a group project may be just the thing.

Part of lessons learned during the REBOOT camp was that we need to evaluate whether what we do is suc-

cessful. Complete the loop and reflect.

With the goal of reconnecting with our church community but also building community with our neighbors, additional ideas include starting a "Food Truck Wednesdays" picnic over the summer. Basically, set aside one Wednesday evening/month to have a few food trucks park in our parking lot and invite the community to come down, set out a blanket or lawn chair and have food and fellowship. There has even been talk about roasting marshmallows and listening to some guitar playing. More details on this are to come. The talent of the "Welcome Team" volunteers will also be necessary to evaluate our efforts to help us reflect and redirect if necessary.


HOLY WEEK SCHEDULE

Gathering Place Piano

Over the course of the last several of months, the Bethel Council and Office have been looking into our Yamaha baby grand piano that currently resides in the Gathering Place. Years ago, this piano was a gift from a member of the community who has since passed away. During these years, the pi-



ano has suffered some damage, and is no longer usable for our Bethel musicians. After having our piano technician come and appraise the instrument, he noted significant damage to the tuning block, hammers, and several other areas. The total to repair the instrument would be around \$10,500. After those repairs, the instrument would likely hold a \$5,000 value. Without those repairs, it does not hold that value. With those things in consideration, the Council

would like to know if anyone from our congregation would like to have this piano as a "pet project" for home. In the hope of maintaining fairness, if you are at all interested in the instrument, please email Tami in the office at bethelmc.church@gmail.com or call the office during the day. If we have multiple individuals interested, we will reach out to folks and seek bids for the instrument. Please note that this instrument does not hold resale value at this time due to the damage it has, and that we want to be very upfront that these damages do put the integrity of the instrument at risk. Also, we are only putting this message out to our Bethel members at this time.


