Seventh Sunday in Easter



Family the Promise to of Great Falls

May 2023 Newsletter

The SOC HOP on April 22, 2023, was a TREMENDOUS success thanks to the generous sponsors, donors, and volunteers who helped support our mission to end childhood homelessness. After crunching the numbers, we garnered close to \$12,000 from the event! These funds go directly to homeless children and their families. As of today's date, Family Promise of Great Falls has served

44 families with 98 children with services to prevent homelessness and provide stability. Compared to last year, we are on track to have three times the impact on the community!

We have been doing well fundraising the last couple of weeks! Taco John's on the Northwest By-pass held a Family Promise Night on April 28 that was a success thanks to our supporters! Give Great Falls Week concluded on Friday, May 5. This has been our most successful year for Give Great Falls Week yet! We totaled \$1,905 in online donations, simply amazing! Thursday May 4 was also Family Promise Day at The Double Barrel Coffee House Café. If you missed Greg's live interview you can find it on The Double Barrel Coffee House Café's Facebook page. We at Family Promise of Great Falls feel so blessed by the generosity of the donors and sponsors for these events.

A story from Promise Place Shelter

This month we spoke with a young couple experiencing homelessness with their three sons. The boys are ages 5, 3, and 2 and are so adorable and full of energy. Mom keeps a smile on her face, but you can tell she is tired. Working two jobs and around sixty-five hours a week, plus raising three young boys, puts a huge strain on this young mom. The boy's father is soon to be a



full-time college student. When asked how long they have been homeless, mom responds with one year. They were separated from one another for a period of time, as it was difficult to find somewhere to stay that could accommodate a family of five. When asked how they became homeless, mom responds with that they were in the process of purchasing a mobile home but got evicted after spending close to \$11,000 on down payment and repairs. Mom and Dad, both tell me that the person they were purchasing the mobile home from was supposed to be a friend of theirs. This friend neglected to pay the taxes on the mobile home, and this led to the family being evicted. They received no money back from what they had invested, and the owner of the mobile home has since moved to another state. This is the first time the young family has ever experienced homelessness, and they were losing hope until they found Family Promise of Great Falls. Greg and Maggie were able to offer them shelter for the entire family, allowing them to be free to function as a family unit once more. Mom and Dad are working hard on their goals of finding a suitable apartment or house to move into soon.



Seventh Sunday in Easter

God Doesn't Do Magic

It happens in the movies all the time: just as we are made to believe that all hope is lost and evil will triumph, suddenly the hero discovers a mystical phrase that will give him supernatural strength to defeat the enemy. Or the heroine finds a charmed sword that gives her the power to do the same. Believing in movie magic can be a welcome respite from the grind of everyday life. Knowing an enchanted word that keeps us impervious to harm sounds incredible—who wouldn't want that? Those moments may work in the movies, but they don't happen in real life.

Don't confuse Jesus' words in today's gospel with a magic spell or incantation. As Jesus prays for his disciples, he knows the suffering they will soon endure because they have come to believe in him. There is no way to avert what they will undergo; each one of his disciples is headed toward a certain and painful death, just as Jesus is. Jesus knows these things cannot be prevented, but that isn't the point of his prayer.

Being in the world means bad things will happen to us. Crosses aren't special charms that keep evil away, and wearing one won't keep you from harm. Tragedies take place, people get sick, bullies victimize, the innocent get blamed. There are no magic words to prevent hardships or disasters. When Jesus prays for the Father to protect those who belong to him, he isn't asking God to keep those bad things from happening. The name of God was never intended to create force fields around us keeping bad things out. God and the one who comes in God's name make us one together with them. In this unity, life always triumphs in the end.
