MAJOR JEFFREY S. SIMPSON

Major Jeffrey S. Simpson is Wing Chaplain at the 120th Airlift Wing, Montana ANG. As Wing Chaplain, he oversees all chapel functions for the 120th AW, 219 RHS and Airmen at the JFHQ, to include supervision of four chaplains and three religious affairs airmen. His duties include conducting or providing for liturgy, rites, and ministrations for all faith groups. He makes pastoral visits to various work stations, and he provides pastoral counseling and ministry to the sick, confined, bereaved and dying. He also participates in local civic, patriotic and religious observances.

Chaplain Simpson hails from Marysville, Michigan and entered the Air Force in February 1993, before joining the Montana Air National Guard (MTANG) in June 1995. His first assignment was an active-duty Missile Chef at Malmstrom AFB. He then joined the MTANG where he served as a Chef, Safety NCO, Additional Duty 1st Sergeant, Training Manager, and



Fitness NCOIC. During this time, he also served as an assistant pastor and Christian school principal for 18 years. After becoming a chaplain in 2012, he served again on active duty at Malmstrom AFB (Sep 2017 – Nov 2020). He has deployed in support of operations NOBLE EAGLE, HURRICANE KATRINA RELIEF, IRAQI/ENDURING FREEDOM and HAITI EARTHQUAKE RELIEF.

Veterans Day Reflection

Terree's and Udo's military religious experiences were less about building relationships in a religious community and more about defining and maintaining our religious foundation in an everchanging world.

The time that Terree served in the Army was from 1971-1992 which with the exception of the end of the Vietnam War and Desert Storm was a time of relative peace. When stationed in the Continental United States, Terree and I looked for an LCA, ALC, or ELCA congregation in the town next to the U.S. Army post. Our associations within the local congregations were fairly brief because at that time Army assignments were usually for three years. This brief stay in a community limited our involvement in the local congregation. For example, once we led the High School Sunday School class for one year and volunteered for reader and communion assistant. We concentrated on learning similarities and differences from each congregation.

Here are some unusual reflections from our military years:

Sunday bible study was an "interesting" experience. In El Paso, Texas, I remember a retired LCA Bishop leading one Sunday a study on the book of Revelation. His opening statement was, "I don't understand why our pastor selected Revelation for bible study. This is a difficult book to study." Moving to another military community, we attended another bible study which was "boring" to say the least. That ended our bible study attendance for many years.

Learning and talking to many pastors opened our exposure to different approaches. In Killeen, Texas, when asked why he did not have a children's sermon during the Sunday worship service, the pastor responded to me, "Because the majority of the adults will listen to the children's sermon and tune out my main sermon."

Another pastor in Rock Island, Illinois made us aware of potential heritage issues when looking for a congregation. He said, "You would have had a problem being accepted in the Lutheran church down the street as you are not of Swedish descent."

An interesting experience was the Christmas Eve service in Fort Hood, Texas. The military chaplain invited a professor from Texas Lutheran University, Seguin, Texas to lead and preach the German language Christmas Eve service on post. Terree and I enjoyed the service. There was only one "small" issue with the sermon. The professor was so happy to speak German that the sermon lasted more than 45 minutes. He could not find an end to his message.

When Terree transferred to Germany, Sunday services were held on the military post. Luckily, there were usually Lutheran chaplains available to lead the service. Terree and I could have gone to a German Protestant church, but decided to stay within the military community. We were able to attend "General Protestant" services and even an Episcopal Holy Week service. This increased our experience in different kinds of worship services.

One very emotional service was a Reformation Day service at the church in Worms, Germany. Many Lutheran chaplains from the many U.S, Army installations as well as soldiers and family from those communities attended the service. Think about the "A Mighty Fortress Is Our God" in a 500 year plus church and strong organ music!

Taegu, South Korea had a very small military Lutheran community. The pastor lead two general Protestant service on Sundays. Once a month, we Lutherans had a small evening Sunday service, about

10 people or less. I remember the pastor saying, "If you can't sing good, sing loud."

Military chaplains were very caring and nurturing within the military communities.
