

Here at Family Promise Great Falls we are gearing up for the holidays with our "Thank You" party on November 16th from 4-7 p.m. The party will be held in our day center, located within our office at 1019 Central Avenue. The party is to show appreciation for all our fabulous volunteers, supporters, donors, and funders. We'd love to have you come and meet our staff and tour the day center, enjoy some cookies, and punch, and see how we've decorated for the holiday season.

CALLING ALL VOLUNTEERS

We are growing as an organization, and that means we're experiencing some growing pains. We have been blessed to have a student from The University of Providence with us for the last few weeks. Her name is Kaylyn Gallagher, and she is a Business Administration major at the university. Kaylyn has been very helpful around the office, doing some light administrative work and helping us to decorate for the holiday season. We're so thankful for your time Kaylyn, and we appreciate the great work that you do.



Additional volunteers are needed, so if you have extra time on your hands, please reach out to Tiffany at tiffanyw@familypromisegf.org. We are seeking volunteers who can fill the following needs:

1.) **In-office supportive services**- (skills required: data entry, Microsoft Office, organization, time management) Volunteers are needed to assist with writing and sending thank you notes, organizing information for referrals, gathering community partner organization information, and assisting Outreach & Operations Specialist in creating innovative solutions to organizational needs.

2.) Event Volunteer Manager: (skills required: Previous management experience, motivating and coordinating volunteer efforts, data tracking, and a high level of organizational skills/professionalism) Volunteer Manager will assist Outreach & Operations Specialist with creating and implementing Volunteer Program Management System. Once the Volunteer Program Management System is in place, the Volunteer Manager will assist with recruitment, training, data tracking, organizing, and assisting volunteers. Volunteer Manager will attend various functions/ events/fundraisers throughout the calendar year. This position will be directly responsible for assisting the Outreach & Operations Specialist with creating innovative solutions to organizational needs.

3.) **Specialized Volunteers**: (various skills required) Volunteers are needed to assist with day-to-day operations at Family Promise Great Falls. These Specialized Volunteers will assist in creating solutions to common office problems. This will include the creation of a data tracking system to be used to track clients, their needs, services provided, and number of office visits/time spent with Family Advocate. These volunteers must have extreme organizational skills, excellent time management skills, and the ability to operate all the software used in the office (primarily Microsoft Office/Google programs) with an emphasis on volunteers who possess a high level of knowledge with Salesforce and Excel spreadsheets.

4.) **Furniture Acquisition/Distribution**: (skills required include the ability to stand/walk for extended periods, lift, carry, and organize heavy pieces of furniture) Volunteers in this position will report directly to the Executive Director, and assist the director with all furniture exchanges. These volunteers will be needed in an "On-Call" capacity, to assist the director at various and infrequent times.

5.) **Community Support Volunteers**: (skills required include owning and operating a vehicle with insurance, outreach abilities, outgoing personality, extensive knowledge of program and services provided). Volunteers in this position will be our voice within our community. Duties will include distribution of materials within the community, making and recording community contacts, asking for donations, maintaining records of contacts/donations received, and will report directly to the Outreach and Operations Specialist. These volunteers will be responsible for educating community partners on the services Family Promise of Great Falls provides.

We are currently trying to put together two baskets for our shelter families for Thanksgiving. We are accepting donations of the makings of a traditional Thanksgiving dinner. GOSPEL MESSAGE November 19, 2023 25th Sunday after Pentecost Who's Got Talent?

Jon Bloom is a cofounder of the Desiring God organization. Speaking to the parable of the talents, he suggests that being given one talent can appear unfair, can wound our pride. He is regularly tempted, he says, to covet his neighbors'



talents. And isn't that always the way? Discounting our own gifts, we envy the abilities of others. And yet, Bloom points out, such behavior is, at its core, the sin of pride.

Our love of God can get eclipsed and our loving relationships with others can be damaged by such pride, which costs us any desire to be a good steward of the gifts God has given us. Hence the description of the last servant as "wicked" and "lazy" (Matthew 25:26). Being given a single talent means less of a chance to really impress the master and improve the servant's own position. Therefore, the servant believes, the master is harsh and unjust.

Pride infects all of us, no matter how many talents we have. In a number of parables, Jesus takes aim at people with a generous amount of prestige, wealth, and power. That's why this parable stings so much. Jesus is talking to all of us. We can and must be on the lookout for the sin of pride, which is at the root of so many unhealthy behaviors. Pride takes so many forms, including discouragement, self-pity, and hopelessness. Every single one of us is a cherished and deeply loved child of God—and God has blessed every single one of us, richly, with talents. Making the effort to be good stewards of the talents we have is a fine way to shut down self-pity and the sin of pride. God has reasons for giving us exactly the talents we have.






Follow Jesus ...
