

#### **Board Member Highlight-Pastor Steve Van Gilder**

A man who always believes in consistently practicing gracious and generous hospitality, Rev. Steve Van Gilder joined the Family Promise Board in 2019 because he believed in our mission. When he first learned of the organization it was named the Interfaith Hospitality Network and the service model was to host homeless families at participating churches on a weekly basis. Through the years, Interfaith Hospitality Network changed its name to Family Promise as it added a variety of programs to address the needs of homeless families. Currently Family Promise of Great Falls is part of a nationwide network of 200 affiliates; an affiliation that brings expertise and efficiencies to the Great Falls.

Steve has served as an ordained pastor in the Montana Synod of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America for 34 years. Prior to his ordained service, Steve served as a full-time youth director in the American Lutheran Church.

When he first moved to Great Falls, he was instrumental in reigniting the annual CROP WALK in addition to working as Bethel Lutheran's pastor. He has been a long-time member of the Great Falls Ministerial Association.

Since his retirement two years ago, he has made himself available for pulpit supply in Lutheran congregations experiencing a transition in leadership. When he is not working with church congregations he enjoys camping, fishing, riding his bike on Rivers Edge Trail, reading, and collecting and playing vinyl albums. He is blessed with his supportive wife, Kaye; two sons, Mark and Micah; and his in-laws who live on a farm near Chester, Montana.

Getting through the Covid-19 pandemic was challenging but he thinks that it gave the board members (only 3 during this time) the opportunity to reach out to all the congregational and community stake holders to find out if there was broad support for our mission. He was greatly gratified by the huge participation in the two Stakeholder Meetings that were held in 2020 and 2021 and was especially proud that the organization came out of hiatus and started serving families by April last year. His vision for Family Promise of Great Falls is to have a static site shelter where we can shelter families, have both our administrative offices, and a day center that would have daycare services.
