Bethel Church Council met in person on Tuesday, November 14, 2023. Here are some highlights from that meeting.

- Tami and Colter are working with Eric Dunn on our sound system, improving internet live stream, and our internal sound. It will be good to have these issues resolved!
- The property committee has been busy on the following projects:
 - ⇒ The old chairs from the sanctuary have been sorted and 75 are kept for the Fellowship Hall, 20 were given to TLC Daycare, 51 have been donated to Central



Christian, and the rest that were damaged or dangerous are being taken to the dump.

- ⇒ The new pavement along the TLC parking lot is also done. The garbage cans have been moved to the 17th Avenue so that the weight of the garbage truck will not be driving over the new drive and damage it.
- Thanks to the Property Management Committee for all their hard work.
 The November 5th potluck was a great success, thanks to Mission Endowment and to all who contributed and all who attended.
- Christmas Eve falls on a Sunday this year. The worship schedule was discussed and decided to be the following:
 - ⇒ No Sunday morning service
 - ⇒ Christmas Eve services at 3:00 pm and 5:00 pm, this will be our traditional candlelight and communion service, held in the sanctuary
 - ⇒ No Christmas morning service
- Council has been working on updating our Constitution and Bylaws, using the Synod's model
 constitution as a guide. These updates will have to be approved by the Synod before we share
 them with the congregation, then hopefully we'll vote on this at the annual meeting. Many
 Council policies were consolidated into Continuing Resolutions and updates were made to the
 Personnel Handbook, which do not require congregational approval. These were both approved by unanimous vote.

Words from the Synod: 2023 National Youth Summit

Once a year, the ELCA holds a
National Youth Summit. The purpose of
this summit is to strengthen the
leadership skills and abilities of youth
that are leaders in their setting. Two
youth and 1 adult from each synod are
invited to attend. This year, the theme
was "Called On the Way" and the focus
was on Advocacy. This seemed like a
surprising theme, and I wondered how
this would apply to developing the
leadership skills of those that attended.

The way in which the leaders of the summit talked of advocacy and dealt with the topics discussed helped the youth present to understand that advocacy has many options and sizes. They learned that any way they care for those who are in need or who are marginalized is advocacy. They came away with eyes better opened to see options around them and with language skills so that what might be controversial can be talked about in ways that allow themselves and others to live in a space of discomfort. They



learned that it is OK to be uncomfortable with while still loving those they are helping, knowing we are all children of God.

The youth from Montana that attended were Morgan May of Our Redeemer Lutheran in Helena and Kian Ryan of Bethel Lutheran in Great Falls. Here is what they had to say afterwards:

Morgan: This year's Youth Summit was a huge opportunity and experience I will never forget. The people I met and the new friends I made are people I will always remember. Especially the other representative from the Montana Synod, Kian Ryan.

Kian: The experience was amazing, the games and singing well connected (me to) others. It was very welcoming and kind. I made friends in those three days, but it felt like I've known them forever. When we left for departure to home, it was a horrible dejection. I miss my new best friends like Morgan May who is part of the Montana Synod and changed my life forever. I'm so glad we met. We continue to stay connected with other friends. We were "Called On the Way."






